AUGUST 2002 MEETING

About 28 people turned out on a cold and windy night for the Annual Meeting and Pipers Night. The Annual Meeting is covered elsewhere in this newsletter in the reports and minutes, so I'll start at about 8.20 pm when the piping began.

John McDonald from Kingaroy was the first piper. Showing good steady blowing on a medium pipe along with good technique which got just a little bit rocky in some of the later tunes. His tunes included *Garb of Old Gaul, Music of the Spey, Cockney Jocks, Doctor Ross, Jean Mauchline, Crossing the Minch* and *Train Journey North*.

Staying with youth, the next player was Ryan Hofmann on a biggish sounding pipe. He showed good form on some big tunes. Later in his selection he tried some really spectacular tunes, as you'll see by the list. Although not all of it was completely mastered, he showed he is developing quickly as one of our leading young players. His tunes included *The Edinburgh City Police Pipe Band, Caber Feidh, Alick C MacGregor, Flora MacLennan's Favourite, Cockerel in the Creel, Jimmy Blue, Geese in the Bog, Trisha's Air, Mason's Apron, Calliope House* and *Rory Gallagher's*.

Next to entertain us was Vaughan Parker. Again he had a big sounding pipe which was steadily blown but with a few wobbles as he went on. There was a good mixture of more traditional and more modern tunes in *La boem, Donald MacLellan of Rothesay, Loch of the Birds, Video Man, Cion A'Bhuntata* and *Donald Cameron's Powderhorn*.

Still keeping with the youth, Michelle Hodder was the next piper. She had a slightly lighter pipe which was just a touch out of tune to start with. She displayed good steady playing but with a little variation in blowing. This improved later as the pipe came into tune—perhaps the problem was the pipes were just a touch too hard. She had good expression in her playing but this suffered a bit in some of the faster music. The selection of tunes she played was certainly fairly demanding—*Battle of the*

Somme, Heights of Dargai, Ian Ruadh's Lament, Chasing Shadows, Abercairney Highlanders, Susan Macleod, Sheila MacMurchie's Dance, Man From Skye, Lark in the Morning and *The Curlew*.

At last someone just a bit older! But not by much—Phillip Cowan. He had a nice big pipe with good blowing. Again he had an ambitious set of tunes, including both the traditional and more modern branches of the bagpipe repertoire. As usual his execution was very good and there was good music throughout. Perhaps he could have had just a touch more consistency in the phrasing of some of the later tunes in his selection. The tunes included *Balmoral Highlanders, Captain Colin Campbell, John Keith Lang, Walking the Surf, Hair of the Dog, Bulgarian Bandit, The Corgi, Itchy Fingers* and *Clumsy Lover*.

Last piper for the night (finally a "mature" player!) was Mark McKenzie on his characteristic strong sounding instrument. He started out with some good rolling 6/8's. Then he played some music for his daughters Erin and Tara to dance to—a beginner's reel to *Davy Knick-Knack*, and a jig to *The Irish Washerwoman*. The to serious Scottish dance music! *Piper's Bonnet, Ewe Wi' the Crookit Horn, Susan MacLeod* and *The Sheepwife*. He finished off the light music with a selection of jigs and reels including *Lark in the Morning, Donald MacLellan's Tuning Phrase, Humors of Tulla, Flowers of Red Hill* and *The Galtee Rangers*. Then he played for us the ground of *Black Donald's March* to cap off what had been an excellent night of piping.

The raffle was drawn by Iain Bruce and won by Maurie DeHayr and then Doug Thoresen brought the night to a close with the usual announcements, with special mention of the Ipswich contest to be held the following Saturday. All then retired for supper..

HOW TO GET TO THE BALMORAL BOWLS CLUB

For those who like to work out their own directions the UBD Reference is Map 160, Reference Q12.

From the Gateway Arterial—turn north at the Lytton Road intersection (just south of the bridge), travel along Route 24 and the Route 23 (Wynnum Road) till you see the Colmslie RSL on your left. Turn in as if going to the RSL but go right through their carpark and continue along Jean Howie Drive for about 350 metres. Turn left into the Bowls Club car park.

From the City—go across the Story Bridge, left into Shafston Avenue, then into Lytton Road and Wynnum Road (Route 23). Go along Wynnum Road until you see the Colmslie RSL on your right. Turn in as if going to the RSL but go right through their carpark and continue along Jean Howie Drive for about 350 metres. Turn left into the Bowls Club car park.

From the west (old Cleveland Road)—Turn into Bennetts Road. Continue along Bennetts Road, across the railway line and a park will appear on your right. Jean Howie Drive goes through the park (the entrance to the drive is near the boundary of the Bulimba Cemetery). Go about 350 metres along the Drive and turn right into the Bowls Club car park.

Opening: Doug Thoresen declared the meeting open at 8:00 pm

Last Annual Meeting Minutes: Moved Jim Johnston, seconded Maurie DeHayr that the minutes as published in the September 2001 Newsletter be taken as read and confirmed. *Carried*

President's Report: Doug Thoresen presented his annual report, a copy of which is printed in the September 2002 newsletter. The report was received with acclamation
