AUGUST MEETING

Our Pipers' Night at the August meeting attracted a bit over 20 people, including three pipers ready to play. The evening started with Lachlan McPhee playing a selection including *Green Hills of Tyrol*, *Dream Valley of Glendaruel*, *Captain C R Lumsden*, *When the Pipers Play*, *Caledonian Society of London*, *Kelsey's Wee Reel* and *Cape Breton Fiddlers*. He was playing his school pipes, which sounded excellent.

Patron Maurie DeHayr was "in charge" for the night and he welcomed all, including Ashley McCullagh from the Redcliffe band who was visiting. We had quite a lot of apologies: Donald and Elizabeth Galloway who were still overseas, Sandra and Vik Supranowicz (ditto), Andrew Roach (just returned from playing with Inverary at the Worlds and "enjoying" his first day back at work), Rob and Isobel McGregor and Glenys and Reg O'Malley. Maurie also mentioned the mini-band contest to be held on the coming Saturday at Wynnum RSL.

The next piper was Peter Hurwood, again with a good pipe, whose selection included *I Will Go Home to Kintail*, *10th HLI Crossing the Rhine*, *MacNeill's of Ugadale*, *The Parting Glass*, *Paddy's Leather Breeches* and *The Flame in the Fiddle*.

Maurie then mentioned that we had received a card from Iain Bruce, thanking the Society for our

remembrance of his mother at the May meeting. He also advised that we had received a proposal from Byron Seymour for the Society to host the 2013 occurrence of the contest he started last year, which comes with considerable prize money and a trophy. All present agreed that we should pursue this and further discussions are now taking place.

Ross Campbell had not been to one of our Monday night meetings for a while, having been overseas and committed to other things but he was present and ready to play and his initial selection included the 3/4s *The Land of Trees*, *Dream Valley of Glendaruel* and *Sunset* and the 6/8s *Dundee City Police Pipe Band* and *Kirkhill*. He then related some of his adventures travelling to the UK with his pipes. He was not allowed to take them in the cabin on QANTAS to the UK because they were "dangerous", and we had thought the legislation about that had been repealed hundreds of years ago! Apparently he had struck a very unreasonable QANTAS official, despite the fact that QANTAS are supposed to have advised the Musicians Union that travelling with instruments is something they support. Flying domestically in the UK, he was told he HAD TO take them in the cabin! The message to take away is that pipers always need to expect the unexpected from airlines. One saving grace was that he

had the pipes in a modern rigid case and even when he had to put them in the hold, they survived perfectly well.

He also mentioned that the chanter reed he was playing was one he had made before he was married, and that was 27 years ago! It must be one of the oldest chanter reeds still being played! He had had to take out the reed he was playing because it was giving trouble on F. The "old faithful" reed sounded quite fine in any case.

He then played another selection, starting with the Urlars of two Piobaireachd, *The MacDonalds are Simple* and *The Massacre of Glencoe*, followed by *An Old Irish Air*, *The roving Journeyman*, *P J Shaw*, *Old Toasty*, *The Boys of Bluehill*, *Champion of the Seas* and *Paddy McGinty's Goat*.

Lachlan McPhee then played the MSR *John MacDonald of Glencoe*, *Maggie Cameron* and *Alick C MacGregor*. and finally Peter Hurwood gave us *Catherine's lament*.

The final event of the evening was Maurie DeHayr presenting Lachlan McPhee with the Patron's Trophy which he actually won at our May meeting, but which had not been available for presentation that night. Still,

better late than never.

All that remained to be done was to draw the raffle and adjourn for supper.

There were apologies from Sandy Dalziel, Cathy Herzig, Andrew McCabe and Ian Yardley.

The morning began with Peter Hurwood giving us the *Lament for Alasdair Dearg McDonnell of Glengarry*.

next we discussed a handout from Ross Campbell on Tuning the Bagpipe which led to some discussion. It has a lot of helpful hints and we can supply copies for those who may be interested.

Next Bruce McLeod also played the *Lament for Alasdair Dearg McDonnell of Glengarry*. Following this, we had a discussion on the proper playing of Piobaireachd movements and the ways to achieve a pleasing result. It was noted that even the great Donald MacLeod at one time had difficulty with his Crunluath and slowed it down considerably to enable it to be played cleanly so we should not be afraid of sacrificing a bit of speed for a pleasing result if necessary.

Next Ross played *Corrienessan's Salute* and we adjourned for morning tea.

Afterwards Ross gave us a handout and a CD for *Black Donald's March* and we proceeded to discuss the correct timing of the tune and singing it through. Ross had rewritten it in 6/8 time and indicated more clearly the way it is actually played, which is at some variance to a literal interpretation of the published music.

After a very full meeting, despite the small numbers, we finished at 1.15pm

Kirby has been attending St Andrew's College and getting tuition from Richard Hawke who is also of course Pipe Major of Canterbury Caledonian which was the other New Zealand band which got through to the finals in Grade 1.
