Our October Meeting featured the Julie Appleton-Seymour contest. Our thanks to Byron Seymour for sponsoring this contest with the very generous total prizemoney of \$1,000. We had about 50 people in attendance.

Donald Galloway opened the meeting with apologies from Andrew Roach and Rob and Isobel MacGregor, There may have been a couple more but the note seems to have been lost. He welcomed Matthew Rigby to the judge's chair. Matthew won this contest last year when it was staged at Whepstead Manor.. Donald also mentioned the upcoming Piobaireachd Group Recital Day.

We had 5 competitors and each of them had to play the tune *Julie's Hornpipe*, composed by Donald Sargeant of New Zealand, and at least 6 parts of jig time (one or more tunes).

Piobaireachd Recital Day

Our Piobaireachd Recital Day was again a great success. We had about 20 in attendance at the beginning, which built up to about 30 at the peak of proceedings. And probably of more importance, there were some 17 tunes played by some 13 pipers - a feast of the great music. The performers covered a range of ages and levels of technical ability, but all made a great contribution to the appreciation of the Great Music of the bagpipe.

Ross Campbell opened the day at about 9:45 with a short talk and then it was straight into the music. Either Ross or Maurie introduced each piper and their tune throughout the rest of the day.

Bruce McLeod - *Lament for Alasdair Dearg MacDonell of Glengarry* - well done with just a little difficulty in the Crunluath but he improves greatly every time we hear him

Abby Dalziel - *The Company's Lament* - last year at the Recital Day Abby played the ground of this tune on the goose but this time it was an assured performance on the Great Highland Bagpipe - a great step forward in the 12 months.

Ian Yardley - *Struan Robertson's Salut*e - Ian had made great strides in the last month in improving his instrument and again is a player making great improvements as a result of attending our group meetings. The drones were a little out at the start but came in a bit and despite a couple of technical difficulties, again a creditable performance.

Maurie De Hayr - You're Welcome Ewen Lochiel - as usual with Maurie this was a very musical performance on a very good instrument with the song carrying on through the variations.

Sandy Dalziel - *The Parading of the MacDonalds* - my notes say simply a good pipe and a good performance - Sandy always seems to provide both.

After a break for morning tea the piping resumed:

Ross Campbell - *The Rout of Glenfruin* - again a very good pipe and a very musical performance - Ross is the model of consistency that every piper should aspire to.

Cathy Herzig - *Lament for the Old Sword* - In only her second public performance Cathy again showed her considerable ability. Despite a few moments of forgetfulness in the variations, this was an improvement on her first public performance which wasn't too bad either. Her great technical ability shows the benefit of the early teaching she received from Donald MacKinnon.

Dennis Browning - *Fair Honey* - yet another great musical performance on a very good pipe. Dennis had travelled all the way from Newcastle to be with us for the day and we certainly appreciated his playing.

Lunch followed.

Peter Murray - Mary's Praise - Peter is a new member of the group and acquitted himself well on a good pipe.

Tam McGirr - The Battle of Auldearn #2 - again a good musical performance on an excellent instrument.

Peter Hurwood - *Lord Lovat's Lament* - Peter is another who has been improving steadily. He has mastered the task of controlling the instrument and it held well throughout. There was just a hint of "crushing" the Taorluath and Crunluath movements but is finding his feet with the great music quite well.

Wayne Kennedy - *The Groat* - Wayne is another very capable player. His pipe was just a little out from the beginning but the tune was well executed musically and technically.

To get ourselves prepared for the final leg, afternoon tea was called.

Ross Campbell - Clanranald's Salute - again a very nice performance on a nice pipe.

Lachlan McPhee - *Glengarry's Lament* - despite a few missed bits of execution in the Taorluath, he finished strongly in the Crunluath. The pipe just lost a bit of its resonance during the tune. he had spent the morning studying, so it was great to see him still coming to put an a very good perofmance overall.

Dennis Browning - *The MacKays' Banner* - my notes say the pipe was beautiful throughout and that was accompanied by excellent music.

Tam McGirr - Lament for the Only Son - again well played on a good pipe.

Ross Campbell - Lachlan MacNeill Campbell of Kintarbert's Fancy - a fine finish to a great day

After farewells and thanks from both Ross and Maurie (and a reminder to turn up for the last meeting of the year on 1 December), we wound up at a bit before 4pm, a little before the scheduled time.
