MARCH MEETING

Donald Galloway opened the meeting and advised we had an apology from Ross Campbell.

Lachlan McPhee was our first player and gave us an extensive set of tunes including: Scotland the Brave, At Long Last, MacCrimmon Will never Return, Duncan Johnstone, Donald MacLeod, Troy's Wedding, Rory MacLeod, Dugald MacColl's Farewell to France, Athol Cummers, Major Manson, My Home, Colin MacKay, The Dirty Lough, Queen of the Rushes

Andrew Roach was next to play and his tunes included Tug Argan Gap, Kenneth J MacLeod, Loch Rannoch, Tam Bain's Lum, Donald MacKillop, MSR P/M Jim McWilliams, Bob of Fettercairn, McAllister's Dirk, Breton Air, Bronnie's Blue Brozzie, Strathspey King, Willie Cummins Rant, John Morrison of Assynt House, Alick C MacGregor, Rodney Hull and the ending of the Inverary and District Pipe Band Medley.

Ian (missed his surname) had brought along an interesting set of pipes made from a dense brown wood. I haven't captured much detail but they were made after an old Scottish pattern with tulip shaped tops. He blew them briefly (drones only) and they had an excellent resonant sound.

Lachlan McPhee then played again. His tunes were Clan MacColl, Abercairney Highlanders, Lady Louden, Shepherd's Crook, Alick C MacGregor and The Sheepwife.

Donald advised that the venue of our next meeting was still uncertain due to the impending closure of the Balmoral Bowls Club but advised everyone to be alert for a change, which will be notified on the website and in our April newsletter.

Finally all that remained was to draw the raffle and have supper.

Piobaireachd Group

The April Piobaireachd Group was quite well attended and also well supplied with tunes and discussion.

First to play was Ross Campbell with one of his tunes for the upcoming Adelaide competition, The Red Speckled Bull. He commented that the tune was quite repetitive and needed some subtleties in timing to bring out the best in it. It is somewhat similar to The Vaunting.

Andrew McCabe was next to play. He was using his recently refurbished (by Martin McBeth) pre-WWII Robertsons. In his tune-up he played the the Donald Morrison tune *Donald Ross of Vancouver*, published in the Gordon Highlanders Book 2. His piobaireachd was *A Flame of Wrath for Patrick Caogach* played in very fiery style.

David Marriner was next to play and he also played *Flame of Wrath* - his style was somewhat different but it was a gain a powerful rendition of the tune.

The tune for the day was *The Black Wedder's White* Tail but before we got to discussing it, Ross Campbell handed out sets of CDs (4 in the set) containing material transcribed from tapes made by Robin Sutherland. Robin had instruction from Bob Brown, Bob Nicol and Jimmy MacIntosh. If fact he went to Scotland at about the time Bob Brown returned from his last trip to Australia. Unfortunately Bob died shortly after his return but Robin stayed on to receive the tuition for the other two great pipers. We are looking to see if it possible to make this material more widely available, perhaps from our website.

Back to the tune for the day - Ross mentioned that it was only to be found in the Piobaireachd Society Book 11. He read out some of the notes from the judges prepared a couple of years ago when it was one of the set tunes. It is similar to MacGregor's Salute. We sang through the tune before breaking for morning tea.

After morning tea Ross played through the tune.

The next player was Bruce McLeod with *Struan Robertson's Salute*. The Taorluath and Crunluath were much improved on time he has played it for us previously.

We then had a discussion about whether to have the May meeting as scheduled, since at least 4 members are travelling to Adelaide for the competition there. On balance it was decided to continue with the meeting and we will supplement the playing with recorded material and discussion if necessary.


Finally Andrew McCabe played *Melbank's Salute*. Ross commented that the beginning of the tune is similar to His Father's Lament for Donald MacKenzie. Bob Brown played a variation on the way most play the beginning of the tune
