MAY MEETING

Our May meeting featured the annual Patron's Trophy competition comprising a March Strathspey and Reel for senior players. About 25 were in attendance and Donald Galloway opened the meeting, introducing the Patron, Maurie DeHayr as our judge for the evening.

We had three competitors - in order of play they were as follows. Each player had submitted two sets of tunes and those shown are the ones chosen by the judge.

Maurie made some comments about the playing in general. He said that care needed to be taken not to rush into the following part in the marches.

Strathspeys needed some touching up in places and the reels had been great. All the pipes were good and overall the contest had been very enjoyable.

Donald called for a round of applause for the competitors and the judge.

Nick Tomkins then played a selection of tunes including *Flight of the Eaglets*, *Brigadier General Ronald Cheape*, *Dora MacLeod*, *Mrs MacPherson of Inveran*, *Train Journey North* and *The Old Wife of the Mill Dust*.

He was followed by Tom McGirr and Lachlan McPhee but unfortunately we don't have lists of their tunes.

By now it was time to draw the raffle and conclude the meeting but before adjourning for supper there was another round of applause for the players. Donald also announced that we would be at the new venue for at least the next three months and next month was a featured pipers night. He also announced that the sponsorship had been confirmed for the Jean Appleton-Seymor contest at our October meeting.

Our New Venue

is the Bulimba Bowls Club in the suburb of Balmoral (some continuity since our previous one was the Balmoral Bowls Club in the suburb of Morningside!)

At the June meeting we had an attendance of eight people. There were apologies from Lachlan McPhee and Tom McGirr.

Ross Campbell was first to play - he started with *The Red Speckled Bull* which was the tune he had in the Adelaide competition but unfortunately he went off just into the thumb variation. Then he played *Mackintosh's Banner*

The set tune for the day was *The Munro's Salute*. Ross distributed copies and then played it. Following that we all sang it through.

Morning tea tea followed and then Peter Hurwood played Lament for Donald of Laggan for the first time on pipes. He had learnt the tune since returning from the Adelaide competition

Ian Yardley played *Kinlochmoidart No 1* again. He is improving steadily but unfortunately missed Variation 1 and stopped part way through taorluath after playing a wrong note.

Bruce McLeod was next with The Company's Lament and showed major improvement in technique.

Maurie then played the *Lament for Rev Dr Norman MacLeod* by Willie Ross as edited by Roderick Cannon and published in The Voice in Winter 2003.

The morning finished with Ross giving Ian Yardley some assistance with his tune.
