AUGUST MEETING

Our August meeting was a very "quiet" one - only 12 people ere present with some overseas. We had apologies from Maurie DeHayr, Margaret Paterson, Joan O'Neill, Ross Campbell and Andrew Roach.

Our featured piper for the night was Lachlan McPhee, who had just returned from playing with the New Zealand Police Pipe Band in the World Pipe Band Championships.

President Donald Galloway conducted an interview with Lachlan about his experiences surrounding his trip.

Some of the points to emerge from the interview were:

Lachlan had only been accepted by the NZ Police in April and his first practice with them (and the only one in New Zealand) was in mid-May. All the rest of the task of familiarising himself with the tunes had been done remotely. He had to learn two MSRs, two Medleys and eight street sets. As well as himself, the band had some guest players from the Auckland Pipe Band and Callum MacSween from Brisbane was playing in their drum corps.

The band assembled in Scotland two weeks prior to the Worlds, just before the North Berwick contest. They practised about four hours a day on pipes and one to two hours on practice chanters. The pipe corps split up

into groups of four for practice.

On the day of the Grade 1 qualifying they did a sound check for half an hour in the morning at their accommodation and then some more preparation at a Masonic Lodge near the ground before going to Glasgow Green for about twenty minutes more playing before competing. They had chosen their sets for the qualifying on the Tuesday prior. After all 22 bands had played in two heats, a march past was held and it was announced which bands had qualified (but not their relative positions). Unfortunately NZ Police did not make it on this occasion. They had placed 6th at North Berwick and 3rd in Perth prior to the Worlds so they were quite satisfied with their achievements. It was the first time they had attended the Worlds since 2008. Applause concluded the interview.

Lachlan then played the sets he had learned for the competition and some of the street sets. His tunes were:

As there were no other pipers to play, the raffle was drawn by Stan Mellick and won by Diana McPhee

So despite the small numbers, it was a good nigh of piping for those who attended. Donald closed the meeting and we continued over supper.
