OCTOBER MEETING

The test piece is a hornpipe *Julie's Hornpipe* written by Donald Sargent (NZ) plus at least six parts of jig time at the competitor's choice. The trophies and substantial prize money are donated by Byron Seymour and we thank him once again for allowing us to host the contest this year.
