AUGUST 2003 MEETING

Our August Meeting attracted a dedicated core of 25 to 30 members and guests – after all it was the Annual Meeting! The business part of the meeting started at about 7:50 pm and finished by 8:20 pm and from then we were into the piping. The Annual Meeting minutes and reports are reproduced separately in this newsletter.

President Doug Thoresen was the first to play on a nice mellow sounding pipe. His tunes included two airs, *Duncan McInnes* and *Wadi Akirit*, the 6/8 *El Alamein* and the jigs *Lt McGuire* and *Paddy O'Rafferty*.

He was followed by Luke Mann, who has improved considerably in his playing recently under the tutelage of John Wilson. His pipe was full toned, steady and well blown and he showed good depth of technique and good expression. The few little slips did not detract from what was a most enjoyable performance. His tunes included Scheihallion, Captain Norman Orr-Ewing, Colin's Cattle, King George V's Army, 79th's Farewell to Gibraltar, Captain Horne and High Road to Linton.

Your scribe next volunteered to have a tune, playing Doug's pipes. A bit of an ambitions selection of tunes tested the fingers at times

but things were going a bit better by the last tune. The tunes included *Loch Rannoch, Mrs Lily Christie, Dr Ross, Rab's Wedding, Orange and Blue* and *Train Journey North*.

We broke for supper and much talk but were eventually induced to sit down again to hear Luke play another selection including Canadian Scots, Leaving Lismore, Scotland the Brave, Marie's Wedding and Auld Lang Syne.

Our final piper for the evening was Iain Bruce. His chanter had a slight crow on high A and the pipes were as usual very resonant. He played his usual interesting set of tunes, including Lewis Turrell's ¾, Far o'er Struy, the 6/8's Braemar Gathering and MacLeod of Mull, hornpipe Donald MacLeod and the jig The Foxhunter. He finished up with a MacCrimmon piobaireachd, Salute on the Birth of Rory Mor Macleod. Iain drew attention to the effective way the top hand notes on the chanter are used in this tune to express rejoicing. He also noted that the tune doesn't have a Crunluath variation

A fine finish to a night of piping only slightly intruded on by the necessary business of the annual meeting.

HOW TO GET TO THE BALMORAL BOWLS CLUB

For those who like to work out their own directions the UBD Reference is Map 160, Q12.

<u>From the Gateway Arterial</u>—turn north at the Lytton Road intersection (just south of the bridge), travel along Route 24 and the Route 23 (Wynnum Road) till you see the Morningside RSL on your left. Turn in as if going to the RSL but go right through their carpark and continue along Jean Howie Drive for about 350 metres. Turn left into the Bowls Club car park.

<u>From the City—go</u> across the Story Bridge, left into Shafston Avenue, then into Lytton Road and Wynnum Road (Route 23). Go along Wynnum Road until you see the Colmslie RSL on your right.
