JULY 2004 MEETING

About 35 people turned out for the Annual Jimmy Durham Memorial contest at the July meeting.

We started with Doug Thoresen warming up his pipes with a few tunes at about 7.40pm. His tunes included *Greenwood Side*, *Murray's Welcome*, *Australian Ladies*, *Highland Harry*, *Alick C MacGregor*, *Cork Hill* and *The Jig of Slurs*.

Next Doug read out the apologies and welcomed Don Chalmers who was visiting from Melbourne. He also welcomed Max Yeo who has moved to Brisbane from new Zealand and his mother Bernie. He mentioned the passing of Flora McNeill (from the Isle of Skye and a long time member of our Society) and Airdrie Stewart (NZ).

Our judge for the evening was Mark McKenzie, soon to depart for Mount Isa as a police prosecutor. He has supplied the following notes of the competition

First to play was Angus Wheeler playing *John McMillan of Barra*. Angus started off slightly nervous, almost missing a Taorluath, but settled down from there on. His blowing was slightly uneven, which showed in the tuning of the drones going up and down with each breath. I have noticed this problem with some brands of synthetic drone reed – Angus' instrument and performance could improve with different drone reeds.. A small slip in the first time through the the 4th part going into the variation too soon put Angus off momentarily but he recovered well and finished in style

Next was Ben Wheadon playing *P/M John Stewart*. Ben started nicely with the tune flowing well. Some small crossing sounds in the 4th bars of each part (C to B strike) marred the performance – some work in that area would greatly improve his future performances. This young piper shows great potential

Our last piper was Max Yeo who played the *Atholl and Breadalbane Gathering*. He played nicely and had the best overall sound of the three, only marred by a slightly sharp F. He showed the New Zealand marching style and a good feel for the 2/4 – it must be "bred-in" to Kiwi Pipers.

Overall, the three players showed huge potential and I recommend all members keep and eye out for them in the future. My only general criticism might be for all three to play a bit faster as seen in the top Scottish and New Zealand competitors. Well done to all three competitors.

Doug then played a couple more tunes while Mark considered his verdict. They included *Leaving Port Askaig, Glendaruel Highlanders*, strathspeys *Orange and Blue* and *Monymusk* and reels *Lexie McAskil*1 and *Dancing Feet*.

finishing his judge's writing, Mark McKenzie was persuaded to have a tune before supper. Staring out with the fine 6/8 by Donald McLeod, Macleod of Mull, he gave us his usual robust and musical set of tunes on a fine sounding bagpipe with plenty of volume and resonant drones. The tunes included the 2/4s Abercairney Highlanders and Mrs John MacColl, the strathspeys Pipers Bonnet and Susan MacLeod and the reel *Pretty Marion*. He apologised that his playing might not be quite up to his usual standard because he was still rather tired from the weekend at the Duckadang retreat where he had been the head piping tutor.

We then adjourned for supper.

Immediately after supper the results were announced. They were

All the competitors were presented with medals once again kindly donated by Jimmy Durham's brother Bill, and Max was presented with the perpetual trophy. Maurie DeHayr then took the opportunity to present a certificate from the recent

Pipe Band College contest to Max Yeo and the Society Patron's Trophy to Matthew Supranowicz.

Angus Wheeler then gave us a couple more tunes, but they took a while since the second one was a Piobaireachd! His pipe was noticeably steadier now until towards the end when the arm got a little tired. He showed good control throughout the tune and the Crunluaths crackled out nicely. The tunes were *Sir Adam Thomson* and *The Lament for Donald of Laggan*.

Ben Wheadon was next called on to play and gave us a selection including, *Togail cùrs'* air Leòdhas (Setting Course for Lewis), Wings, Will Ye no' Come Back Again and Paddy's Leather Breeches on a nice firm pipe, showing good execution.

Max Yeo then played a few tunes starting with the air *Top Deck in Perth* with all the trills on the F and followed up with *Jimmy Blue, The Banjo Breakdown* and various strathspeys and reels. His pipe was strong and resonant and generally well blown apart from the occasional choke.

The raffle was then drawn by Donald Chalmers and won by Hugh Maclean.

However, we weren't finished with the piping because Matthew Supranowicz had brought his pipes along. On a fine resonant instrument he gave us a selection including *Edinburgh City Police Pipe Band, Donald MacLellan of Rothesay, Kirstie MacCallman's Favourite, Ca' the Ewes, Auld Adam* and *Braemar Gathering*.

Thus another fine night of piping finally came to an end.

Turn in as if going to the RSL but go right through their carpark and continue along Jean Howie Drive for about 350 metres. Turn left into the Bowls Club car park.

<u>From the west (old Cleveland Road</u>—Turn into Bennetts Road. Continue along Bennetts Road, across the railway line and a park will appear on your right. Jean Howie Drive goes through the park (the entrance to the drive is near the boundary of the Bulimba Cemetery). Go about 350 metres along the Drive and turn right into the Bowls Club car park.

- 8. All trophies are to be collected on the day unless alternative arrangements have been made. Solo Piping and Drumming trophies will be presented on Saturday afternoon and Drum Major and Band trophies on Sunday afternoon
- 9.All competitors compete at their own risk. No liability is accepted for injury or loss sustained by any person taking part in any event.
- 10. The organisers reserve their right to alter the programme and times as provided in the APBA rules.
- 11. All soloists and band persons should endeavour to participate in the Massed Band on Sunday afternoon.
