MAY 2004 MEETING

Our May meeting featured the annual Patron's Trophy, an MSR competition for senior (Open and Intermediate) Pipers. About 30 members and supporters turned up to enjoy the evening and we had three competitors: Hazel Osborne, Matthew Supranowicz and Cory Dale.

Doug Thoresen began the evening with announcements. Apologies were received from Ian Davidson, Jane Hancox, Robert Baker, Rose McLelland, Jack McCandlish, David Sinclair and Iain Bruce

Then it was over to the competition. Our judge for the evening was Roy Gunn and the following has been adapted from his notes:

Hazel Osborne: Taking of Beaumont Hamel, Susan Macleod, Lexie McAskill. Pipes were not spot on. The march was nicely played but perhaps a little round and some movements not even. A good transition to the strathspey. Pointed well but could have had more lift. A long pause before the reel. Reel well played but again could have had more pointing.

Matthew Supranowicz: Edinburgh City Police Pipe Band, Kirsty McCallman's Favourite, Ca' the Ewes. A good pipe. March nicely played but pointing not always even. Good transition to the strathspey which could have been a little more pointed to give more lift. Again a good transition to the reel which was good, if a little round in places.

Cory Dale: Mrs John McColl, Dora Macleod, The Smith of Chilliechassie. Good Pipe. March nicely played but lacked pointing. Good transition to strathspey which could have done with more pointing to get some lift. Another good transition to the reel which was a little round in parts.

While the judge deliberated, we broke for supper.

After supper Mathew Supranowicz was

prevailed on to play the piobaireachd with which he won the recent silver medal competition run by the RU Brown Piping Society of South Australia, *The Battle of Auldearn No 2*.

Cory Dale next gave us a tune or two on his Macedonian bagpipe, an instrument with a single drone and very large bag tied at the end. The chanter was similar to a loud practice chanter.

3rd Hazel Osborne

Unfortunately we had not received the Patron's Trophy back from last year but Patron Maurie DeHayr presented the annual "miniature" to Matthew Supranowicz.

The raffle was the next event of the night. Sandy Campbell was the drawer and Geoff Goward was the winner.

Hazel Osborne next played an own composition, an air called *James McMillan*.

Cory then gave us a few tunes including Tommy Tully's Air, Town of Ballybay, The Silver Spear, Gravel Walk, MacFaddians, and Francis Mortons and finally Matthew finished off with a selection including She Moved Thro' The Fair, The Man From Skye, Braes of Mellinish, John Barclay, Cameron MacFadyen, Susan MacLeod and The Sheepwife.

Doug thanked Roy Gunn for judging for the competition and the three competitors joined to play *Green Hills* and *The Battle's O'er* to finish off the evening.

Richard is currently recovering from a mild stroke but has been working with and tuning his band at competitions.

We will put you directly in touch with the person who wants to hire the piper and you work out final details with them. People available for New Years Eve or Anzac Day are particularly needed.

HOW TO GET TO THE BALMORAL BOWLS CLUB

For those who like to work out their own directions the UBD Reference is Map 160, Q12.

From the Gateway Arterial—turn north at the Lytton Road intersection (just south of the bridge), travel along Route 24 and the Route 23 (Wynnum Road) till you see the Morningside RSL on your left. Turn in as if going to the RSL but go right through their carpark and continue along Jean Howie Drive for about 350 metres. Turn left into the Bowls Club car park.

<u>From the City—go</u> across the Story Bridge, left into Shafston Avenue, then into Lytton Road and Wynnum Road (Route 23). Go along Wynnum Road until you see the Morningside RSL on your right. Turn in as if going to the RSL but go right through their carpark and continue along Jean Howie Drive for about 350 metres. Turn left into the Bowls Club car park.

<u>From the west (old Cleveland Road</u>—Turn into Bennetts Road. Continue along Bennetts Road, across the railway line and a park will appear on your right. Jean Howie Drive goes through the park (the entrance to the drive is near the boundary of the Bulimba Cemetery). Go about 350 metres along the Drive and turn right into the Bowls Club car park.

Spoke to Jan Geurin (Archie's granddaughter) at the games and mentioned our conversation. She said it had never been published and would appreciate seeing it circulated. It mightn't suit all tastes but I promise you, Pipers will like it."
