MARCH 2005 MEETING

About 30 people turned up for our March meeting, including plenty of pipers with their pipes! Apologies were received from Glenys and Reg O'Malley, Vaughn Parker, Robert Baker and Doug and Hetty Thoresen. In Doug's absence vice president Bob Payne did "the announcing".

Your scribe started off the evening with a few wee tunes including *Dr Ross*, *Highland Cradle Song*, *Macleod of Mull* (until I got lost in the 3rd part!), and *Swan on the Lake*.

Next to play was a pupil of Sandy Campbell's', Chris Truscott, who played us the 2/4 he will be playing at Maclean, *The Taking of Beaumont Hamel*.

Maurie DeHayr next stepped up to the boards. After a few 4/4's (Lord Lovat's Lament, Loch Ruan and Alex MacKay's Farewell to the Tayside Police), he set his drones and launched into the 6/8 Ellen Orr and John D Burgess. He had a little trouble with his bass drone but otherwise the pipes were sounding well especially by the end of his performance. His othe tunes included the Alan Dodd's Farewell to Scotland, Kantara to El Arish and Glengarry Gathering and the ground of the Piobaireachd Salute to Donald.

Jordan Whicker was next to play. He had a firm sounding pipe and gave us a very "meaty" selection of solid tunes, all played in a deliberate and musical manner. They included *Out of the Air, The Radar Racqueteer, La Boem, Spill the Beer, Rakish Paddy, The High Drive, The Conundrum, The Duchess of Edinburgh, Caledonian Society of London, Major David Manson, Lucy Cassidy and The Braes of Mellinish. If anything, he perhaps a little too carefully, but at his stage of learning that's probably better than an over-flamboyant style.*

Matthew Supranowicz was next. After a little difficulty getting his drones just right, his pipes were sounding very solid and resonant. Another very solid selection followed, with excellent technique and

expression. The tunes included *Duncan MacGillivray*, *Donald MacLennan of Rothesay*, 71st *Highlanders*, *Edinburgh City Police Pipe Band*, *Susan MacLeod*, *Dora MacLeod*, *Lt Col D J S Murray* and *Miss Proud*. By the concluding Piobaireachd (ground and singling of Taorluath variation of *Lament for the Little Supper*), the pipes had "sweetened up" considerably and were going really well.

lain Bruce continued the evening. On his usual fine bagpipe with all the notes exactly in the right place, he gave us again an interesting selection of tunes. Starting with the 4/4's *The Battle of Waterloo, 51*st *Highland Division, The Wee Highland Laddie* and *Flett from Flotta*, he went on with the 2/4 *Dick Herring*, 6/8 *Alex Haddow's Welcome to Stromachullin*, 2/4s *The 74th's Farewell to Edinburgh* and *David Ross of Rosehall* and the strathspey and reel *Lady Louden* and *The Grey Bob*. He finished up with the Piobaireachd *Lament for Sir James MacDonald of the Isles*.

Our final piper was Malcolm McRae. Playing a good solid pipe he started off with the 6/8's **Dovecote Park** and **Farewell to the Creeks** and continued with a most musical sounding selection of "classic" light music including the 2/4s **Earl of Mansfield, Siege of Delhi** and **Donald MacLean's Farewell to Oban**, strathspeys **Highland Harry** and **Caledonian Canal** and reels **Alick Cameron** and **Rejected Suitor**. He then topped it off with the haunting music of **The Desperate Battle of the Birds**.

By this time everyone was well and truly ready for the drawing of the raffle and for supper to finish off a fine evening of piping. A review of the tunes played shows that we covered a large range of the music of the highland bagpipe.

Piobaireachd Meetings

At the suggestion of Malcolm McRae, we are moving to organise meetings, perhaps on a

monthly or even more frequent basis, to enable greater discussion, playing, and possibly teaching of Piobaireachd. The idea is that the meetings should be on the weekend and last most of the day.

We are looking for a venue, preferably air-conditioned, sufficient to accommodate about 15-20 people, ideally with a couple of extra rooms for tuning pipes, and within reach of a cafe where we could get lunch.

Ideally it should be somewhere on the south side of Brisbane, or between Brisbane and the Gold Coast, close to the Pacific Motorway.

Change of President for Comunn na Piobaireachd New Zealand

After 38 years as President of Comunn na Piobaireachd New Zealand Inc, The Right Honourable Sir Ian McKay has retired. His replacement is Oban Gold Medalist, John Hanning. Sir Ian was one of the main architects of the Society as it exists today. His retirement marks a significant point in the Society's history. The following tribute is reproduced from the Commun na Piobaireachd website.

Ian with his late brother Neville were the principal architects in the formation of the Society in 1957. Both had been to Scotland and met distinguished players and teachers there. The state of knowledge of classical piping in New Zealand at that time was confined to a very few mostly immigrant pipers some of whom were reluctant to share their knowledge lest it impact on competition results. Ian drafted a Constitution based on the Constitution of the Piobaireachd Society of Scotland and persuaded all the prominent pipers of the day to become members. The application for incorporation lists such prominent names as: Neil McPhee, Louis MacKinnon, Neville McKay, George Wakefield, Bruce McCann, Neville Thyne, Frank MacKinnon, Angus MacArthur, Alan Guild, Colin Addison and Alan McPhee.

Ian and Neville commenced regular Piobaireachd tuition classes initially at the back of McPhee's shop and there would be few of the younger players of the day who did not attend for some period. In 1967 Ian succeeded Neil McPhee (who himself was a player of immense stature in New Zealand) as President of the Society. For the next 38 years Ian led the Society in the development and encouragement of piobaireachd tuition throughout New Zealand; organising tours by such legendary players as Donald MacLeod, Bob Brown and Donald McPherson; improving the status of all aspects of the Society's Gold Medal Competition.

Throughout his period of office Ian insisted on the maintenance of the highest standards in every aspect of the Society's work. He carefully monitored changes in office bearers and members of the Music Committee of the Society to ensure that its members were players of repute; developed the Society's competition brochure in a manner which enhanced its image; secured the acceptance of patronage by successive Governors-General; maintained contact with pipers of stature in Scotland.

Ian's position as a director of a number of leading New Zealand listed companies opened the door to sponsorship opportunities for the Gold Medal prizes. When he was appointed a judge of the High Court and later the Court of Appeal and his knighthood was conferred the Society benefitted from the prestige involved in a President holding high public office who seldom missed an opportunity to acknowledge the Society in areas of public life where its existence would be little known.

His oft repeated determination to ensure quality succession planning became an annual feature of the Society's AGM. This year however it was clear that he could no longer be persuaded to continue and it would have been a poor appreciation of his great work to attempt to do so. His knowledge and experience will continue to be available to us and the Society owes him a huge debt for his untiring work and dedication.

HOW TO GET TO THE BALMORAL BOWLS CLUB

For those who like to work out their own directions the UBD Reference is Map 160, Q12.

From the Gateway Arterial—turn north at the Lytton Road intersection (just south of the bridge), travel along Route 24 and the Route 23 (Wynnum Road) till you see the Morningside RSL on your left. Turn in as if going to the RSL but go right through their carpark and continue along Jean Howie Drive for about 350 metres. Turn left into the Bowls Club car park.

<u>From the City</u>—go across the Story Bridge, left into Shafston Avenue, then into Lytton Road and Wynnum Road (Route 23). Go along Wynnum Road until you see the Morningside RSL on your right. Turn in as if going to the RSL but go right through their carpark and continue along Jean Howie Drive for about 350 metres. Turn left into the Bowls Club car park.

From the west (old Cleveland Road—Turn into Bennetts Road. Continue along Bennetts Road, across the railway line and a park will appear on your right. Jean Howie Drive goes through the park (the entrance to the drive is near the boundary of the Bulimba Cemetery). Go about 350 metres along the Drive and turn right into the Bowls Club car park.
