JULY 2005 MEETING

About 35 people turned out for our midwinter meeting. Doug Thoresen did the announcements and gave an apology for Maurie DeHayr, by then in the UK. He also mentioned the recent passing of John D Burgess.

The first activity of the evening was a couple of rounds in our Knockout competition. The first was a match between Jordan Whicker and Hazel Osborne. Jordan had a firm & resonant bagpipe with just a little uneven blowing. He showed good technique and mostly good phrasing and his selection included She Moved Through the Fair, Crossing the Minch and The Banjo Breakdown. Hazel also had a good resonant pipe. She incorporated a March Strathspey and Reel into her selection. The selection was very musical but there were a couple of stumbles. Her tunes included Air For Small Pipes, Australian Ladies, Highland Whiskey, Strathspey King, Masterpiece, Dancer, Crack a Tinny and Alan MacPherson of Mosspark.

The next match was between Lachlan Durham and Max Yeo. Lachlan had a nice nice pipe and some very spectacular sounding playing, with tunes including McGeachie's Mobile Party Unit, The Egg and the Poodle, The Kilted Avenger, The Bit in the Middle, P/M Sandy Gordon and Annie Grant. Max had a quieter pipe and showed good execution and phrasing. The tunes included Una McIntyre, Matt's Return from Boston, If the Weather Will Allow Me, Highland Mafia and a selection of reels. His drones went off a touch

While we waited for the audience votes to be counted, Doug Thoresen ventured to open his pipe case & extract a nice sounding pipe on which he exerted his usual musical spell. His tunes included the 6/8s Farewell to the Creeks and 10th HLI Crossing the Rhine, Leaving Lewis, retreats Colin's Cattle and Lochanside, 2/4s Southall and 51st Highland Division at Wadi Akirit and the strathspey and reel Monymusk and Johnny MacDonald.

The time had come to announce the knockout winners: they were Jordan Whicker and Lachlan Durham. It is good to note that all competitors were well supported in the audience voting.

The next activity for the night was the annual Jimmy Durham Memorial Contest for junior players.

Donald Galloway was our judge and he has supplied the following account of the competition:

The Jimmy Durham Memorial Competition, July 2005

There is no doubt in my mind that the bar has been raised with respect to the performances being given by competitors of elementary and sub-intermediate level these days.

I had the pleasure of judging the Jimmy Durham Memorial Competition at the July meeting of the Pipers' Society, the competition piece being a four parted 2/4 march played once through.

Vaughn Parker was the first to play and he selected Colin Thompson as his tune. Vaughn's pipe was nicely tuned and produced a balanced tone despite a certain robustness of sound from the bass drone. He played his tune with nice lift and his finger work was well executed.

Next to play was Lachlan Durham and Lachlan selected The 79th's Farewell to Gibraltar as his tune. Lachlan's bagpipe was also nicely tuned and balanced and produced a more mellow sound. Lachlan also played his tune with good lift and precise fingering.

Unfortunately there were only the two competitors and the competition was close however on this occasion, the prize went to Vaughn.

Although it sometimes proves difficult to attract interest from players to compete in the various solo competitions which are held from time to time, it is encouraging to see the talent that is being produced.

I've no doubt the playing skills being displayed, particularly from the more junior players, is testament to the high standard of tutoring that is being given and speaks well for the future of piping in this country.

Supper was taken before announcing the result and afterwards some of our competitors gave us some

more tunes. Lachlan's included *Bengullion*, *Ballochyle* and *Mrs Lily Christie*. Vaughn's tunes included *Loch of the Birds, Colin MacKay, P/M George Allan, Alan MacPherson of Mosspark, Thief of Lochaber* and *The Judge's Dilemma*.

Max Yeo also played a selection including Top Deck in Perth, Jimmy Blue and Banjo Breakdown followed by Jordan with the ground of MacGregor's Salute, Major Manson of Clachanstrushal, Hector the Hero, The Braes of Mellinish, The Rakes of Kildare and The Mason's Apron.

An overall comment on the night would be that there was a uniformly high standard of bagpipe which would have graced any pipers' society in the world.

By now the time was getting on so Doug Thoresen closed the evening. In doing so he acknowledged Don Chalmers from Melbourne who was present in the audience. The raffle was drawn, with Ron Fleming winning the first prize and Garry Forno the second prize.

Knockout Contest

This month sees the third set of first round "matches" in our Knockout Contest, which will conclude with the November meeting. The test piece is a Medley selection of 3-5 minutes.

The "first round" is being played over the June, July and August meetings, with several "matches" each meeting. In September and October, we will have the quarter finals (two each meeting) and in November we will have the Semi-Finals and Final.

Piobaireachd Meetings

Our August meeting again drew a good attendance of about 15 Piobaireachd devotees, despite Malcolm McRae and Maurie DeHayr being in Scotland, Matthew Supranowicz in France, and other apologies for Ellie McCauley, Max Yeo and Sandy Dalziel

Iain Bruce chaired the meeting and welcomed Alistair McInnes to his first meeting. As Alistair lives in Grafton, coming to a meeting is a substantial effort for him.

Alistair McInnes was first to play. After warming up with a couple of 6/8s, we heard *Lord Lovat's Lament* and the *Lament for Rory Mor MacLeod*. Roy read the stories of the tunes. Alistair played the Kilberry Book setting of Lord Lovat's, as distinct from the Angus MacKay setting played by Malcolm McRae. There is not a large difference but Roy ventured the view that the Kilberry setting is better structured.

Iain next welcomed another member to his frst meeting – Fraser Bolton. Played our "set tune" from the previous month - *Glengarry's Lament*.

Our morning tea break then followed before we got into our set tune for this month, *Lady Doyle's Salute*. As usual, Roy led us in singing through the tune He encouraged us to mark our scores with the comments he made as he showed us how particular parts of the tune run. He also gave an explanation of the rather compressed shorthand notation used in the Kilberry Book scores (which we were using). This shorthand can be a good aid to memory of the tune. There was also some discussion on the need to hear a tune and hear it often to understand how it goes. This is why it is very difficult to learn from a score alone, even with added explanatory material. In recent times, the greater availability of CDs has eased this problem.

There was also discussion about whether an a'Mach variation should be played in Lady Doyle (and more generally when one should be played)

Finally, Iain Bruce played Lady Doyle's Salute for us. Afterwards, Roy Gunn gave some more comments on the "run down" in the tune and went through a number of legitimate alternatives for the way of playing it.

We were still to hear two more tunes. First Iain Bruce played *The Bicker*. Finally we heard an own composition from Alistair McInnes – *The Lament for Jock McCabe*

The next meeting will be on Sunday 4 September and the set tune will be Chisholm's Salute

HOW TO GET TO THE BALMORAL BOWLS CLUB

<u>From the west (old Cleveland Road</u>—Turn into Bennetts Road. Continue along Bennetts Road, across the railway line and a park will appear on your right. Jean Howie Drive goes through the park (the entrance to the drive is near the boundary of the Bulimba Cemetery). Go about 350 metres along the Drive and turn right into the Bowls Club car park.
