NOVEMBER 2004 MEETING

Our final meeting for 2004 attracted about fifty members and guests. A Pair of Pipers and an Open Medley Contest were advertised. We had six entries for the Medley but only one Pair of Pipers.

Doug Thoresen started off the evening and announced apologies from Glenys and Reg O'Malley. He also welcomed Malcolm McRae, who is now resident on the Gold Coast and has joined the Society.

We also remembered Trevor Warnock and Errol Chetham, who had passed away since our last meeting.

We had Vaughn Parker and Jordan Whicker play as a Pair of Pipers first. The judge for the evening was Maurie DeHayr. Doug Thoresen acted as steward while your Secretary was pressed into service as the announcer. The comments shown in italics in relation to each performance are adapted from Maurie's judges' sheets.

Vaughn and Jordan played D/M Ross Huth, F A Malcolmson, Out of the Air, New Year in Noosa, La Boem, Spill the Beer, Rakish, Paddy, High Drive and Mason's Apron. *Pipes were well set with chanters nice and bright. Drones well set and held throughout. The opening E was not quite together but tunes were well played together with just a little unsteadiness in some bottom hand work. The change from the air was slightly rushed by one player and there was a slight miss with a Birl in the second tune. A good finish capped off a great effort.*

Of the six entries in the **Open Medley**, Phil Cowan was persuaded at the last minute to enter and Jordan was recruited by Doug, but this made it a good contest, so thanks to all who made the effort.

Phillip Cowan was first to play with Balmoral Highlanders, Molly Connell, Danny Boy and Crossing the Minch. Pipes were steady with drones well set. A good steady opening but error at the end of the first tune. Good change to strathspey. Air a nice touch with good flow of the native rhythm. Hornpipe had a slight choke towards the end of the first part.

Matthew Rigby was the next to play and he gave us MacCrimmon Will Never Return, The Cloudmaker, Alan MacPherson of Mosspark, The Hammer Finger, an "unnamed" jig and reel (Matthew didn't know their names!), The Easy Club, Rakish Paddy and Break Yer Bass Drone. A good rich chanter tone, bright and well balanced. Drones well set and holding. Good quality playing

and total control of tempo after a well done start which commanded attention immediately. Just a slight undulation of High A in the first tune and some changes just a little quick

Iain Bruce was the next competitor. I don't have any tunes for him because, most uncharacteristically for Iain, his outer tenor drone stopped during the first tune and he stopped playing. Pipes were set fine with good chanter balance and drones giving good harmonics through the chanter scale. An interesting opening tune attracting immediate attention. Pity about the outer tenor.

Jordan Whicker was next, with Major Manson of Clachantrushal, La Boem, The Big Birl, The Braes of Mellinish, The Magpie, She Moved Through the Fair and Itchy Fingers. Pipe going well with chanter bright and clear. Opening march steady with good flowing rhythm for the most part. A very interesting set and well played except for a few slips.

Cory Dale followed Jordan and his tunes were Tommy Tully's Air, Rose Among the Heather, Town of Ballybay (?), Silver Spear, Incubator, The Tourist, The Tourist (Jig), Lush Experience and Colonel Smithers. Pipes well set up—balanced. Chanter pitch nice and rich vibrant drones. Nicely played air attracted attention at start and a well set out medley commanding attention throughout. Fingerwork clean throughout apart from a couple of missed B strikes. A slight squeal towards the end of the set.

Matthew Supranowicz was the final competitor, playing Banks of Lochiel, an "unknown" strathspey, Rodney Hull QC, Lorna's Jig, an "unknown" jig. Gotterdamerung, Cathy Anne McPhee's Jig, two "unknown" reels and Gravel Walk. Pipe going fine at opening but Bass Drone just slightly off. A steady opening to a selection played with confidence. When changing tunes to a different rhythm, just a little uncertainty at times.

After the contest was finished, Doug Thoresen illustrated the possibility of even the very best suffering the fate of Iain Bruce during the contest by relating the story of R U Brown playing at the London Competition and having his Bass Drone stop, forcing him to abandon the performance.

Valé Hugh MacLean

As most will be aware, our long time and much loved member, Hugh MacLean, passed away suddenly on the 8th of December last.

Hugh's musical playing and Gaelic singing had long entertained us, although his health had restricted his activities in recent years.

Hugh was born in 1928 in Tiree, and in due course took over the family croft. However, the difficulty of making a living as a crofter in Scotland in the 1950's led him and his family to make an assisted passage to Australia in 1965. He was sponsored by the Tenterfield Pipe Band, became their Pipe Major on his arrival and continued so for many years. He was responsible for continuing and expanding the fine tradition of piping in that part of New South Wales.

With closure of the meatworks in Tenterfield, where he worked, Hugh and his family moved to Brisbane, initially to similar work. However, in due course he became one of the first civilian members of the Queensland Police Pipe Band in about 1982 or 1983. He also had a long and productive association with the City of Brisbane Caledonian Pipe Band, as well as with our Society.

Hugh was one of nature's gentlemen and a patient teacher of the piping art. He always sought to take the positive approach but was very certain of what was good quality and what was not. A very large number of his family and friends attended his funeral, including many members of the Society, and Pipe Major Roddy MacDonald of the Queensland Police played the lament.

We express our sympathy to May and the family on their sad loss, but we count ourselves fortunate to have known such a fine piper and a fine person.

HOW TO GET TO THE BALMORAL BOWLS CLUB

For those who like to work out their own directions the UBD Reference is Map 160, Q12.

<u>From the Gateway Arterial</u>—turn north at the Lytton Road intersection (just south of the bridge), travel along Route 24 and the Route 23 (Wynnum Road) till you see the Morningside RSL on your left. Turn in as if going to the RSL but go right through their carpark and continue along Jean Howie Drive for about 350 metres. Turn left into the Bowls Club car park.

<u>From the City—go</u> across the Story Bridge, left into Shafston Avenue, then into Lytton Road and Wynnum Road (Route 23). Go along Wynnum Road until you see the Morningside RSL on your right. Turn in as if going to the RSL but go right through their carpark and continue along Jean Howie Drive for about 350 metres. Turn left into the Bowls Club car park.

<u>From the west (old Cleveland Road</u>—Turn into Bennetts Road. Continue along Bennetts Road, across the railway line and a park will appear on your right. Jean Howie Drive goes through the park (the entrance to the drive is near the boundary of the Bulimba Cemetery). Go about 350 metres along the Drive and turn right into the Bowls Club car park.
