FEBRUARY 2005 MEETING

About 35 people were in attendance for the first meeting of the year.

Doug Thoresen warmed us up with a few wee tunes and then started the meeting. He mentioned apologies for Robert Baker and May Maclean and also drew attention to the passing of Hugh Maclean and David Scotland. David was a long time Secretary of the NSWPBA and well known to many in Queensland

Doug also mentioned the visit of Rab Wallace from the College of Piping. He will be judging the "Lorient" contest at the Irish Club on 15 May and there will be a seminar and/or recital on Thursday 12 May.

Jordan Whicker was our first piper for the evening. He blew a firm resonant pipe to kick off our year. Starting with a few relaxing 4/4s he then went on to play a varied including Scotland the Brave, Lord Lovat's Lament, Come by the Hills, Itchy Fingers, Lover, Clumsy Major Manson of Caledonian Clachantrushal, Society of London, Major Manson, Skye Boat Song, J K MacKenzie, Castle Rock Ceilidh and Rocking the Baby. He was looking for some comments on his solo tunes which I'm sure he got later in the evening. His playing certainly made great listening There was just a wee rattle in one of the tenor drones (or so it seemed). Jordan said that he had a new set of eezedrone reeds in them and that was probably the cause.

Our next piper was Iain Bruce, playing his usual excellent pipe (no sign of stopping drones tonight!). Your scribe thought at first that Ian had set his drones a wee bit sharp but as he progressed the chanter pitch dutifully rose just enough to meet the drones. Starting with the ¾s Lewis Turrell's ¾ and Far over Struy, he moved the tempo up a bit to the 6/8s Seumas MacNeil and John MacKenzie's Farewell to Strathglass. Back down in tempo to the Air Morag Beag and then launching into a string of Jigs – David Ross, The Foxhunters, Welcome the Piper and Drops of Brandy. He finished up

with the 2/4's *Charles Edward Hope Vere* and *Leaving Lochalsh*.

Next to play was Roy Gunn on another good pipe with plenty of drone volume. He is almost over the problems he had with his hand after having it operated on some time ago. He started fairly "quietly" but gave us plenty of good music as he went on. His pipe seemed to become sweeter in sound as he went on and the tunes were played in a bold style. They included An Old Highland Air, Memories of Wee Donald, Braes of Castle Grant Inveran, **Bengullion**. He finished up with a strong rendition of the Piobaireachd Massacre of Glencoe. As Doug Thoresen remarked just afterwards - "Piobaireachd is the music for mature fingers" His pipe by now was going very well.

Malcolm Macrae was next to play. I'm not sure if it's the first time he has played at our Society but certainly the first time for a very long time. On a firm and resonant pipe with plenty of volume, he set off in fine musical style, building from the simpler tunes through to the concluding Piobaireachd. The tunes included the air Loch Rannoch, 2/4s Captain Grant and Dornoch Links, the MSR John MacColl's March to Kilbowie Cottage, Ewe wi' the Crookit Horn and Lexie MacAskill, 6/8s P/M Sam Scott and Queen Elizabeth's March and the Piobaireachd Colin Macrae of Inverinate's Lament.

Well satisfied with our diet of Piping, we then adjourned for supper.

After supper we heard from Jordan Whicker again. His pipes were a bit mellower by now. He gave us another fine selection including the air She Moved Through the Fair, the ground of The MacGregor's Salute, The Duchess of Edinburgh, Captain Colin Campbell, La Boem, Spill the Beer, Rakish Paddy, The High Dive and We Are Australian. He is certainly maturing strongly as a player.

All that was left then was to draw the raffle. Mary Campbell did the honours and Innes Barker won the prize. We had a few additional draws for lesser prizes but the only winners I

managed to record were Donald Galloway and Innes Barker (again!).

Piobaireachd Meetings

At the suggestion of Malcolm McRae, we are moving to organise meetings, perhaps on a monthly or even more frequent basis, to enable greater discussion, playing, and possibly teaching of Piobaireachd. The idea is that the meetings should be on the weekend and last most of the day.

We are looking for a venue, preferably air-conditioned, sufficient to accommodate about 15-20 people, ideally with a couple of extra rooms for tuning pipes, and within reach of a cafe where we could get lunch.

Ideally it should be somewhere on the south side of Brisbane, or between Brisbane and the Gold Coast, close to the Pacific Motorway.

HOW TO GET TO THE BALMORAL BOWLS CLUB

For those who like to work out their own directions the UBD Reference is Map 160, Q12.

From the Gateway Arterial—turn north at the Lytton Road intersection (just south of the bridge), travel along Route 24 and the Route 23 (Wynnum Road) till you see the Morningside RSL on your left. Turn in as if going to the RSL but go right through their carpark and continue along Jean Howie Drive for about 350 metres. Turn left into the Bowls Club car park.

<u>From the City</u>—go across the Story Bridge, left into Shafston Avenue, then into Lytton Road and Wynnum Road (Route 23). Go along Wynnum Road until you see the Morningside RSL on your right. Turn in as if going to the RSL but go right through their carpark and continue along Jean Howie Drive for about 350 metres. Turn left into the Bowls Club car park.

<u>From the west (old Cleveland Road</u>—Turn into Bennetts Road. Continue along Bennetts Road, across the railway line and a park will appear on your right. Jean Howie Drive goes through the park (the entrance to the drive is near the boundary of the Bulimba Cemetery). Go about 350 metres along the Drive and turn right into the Bowls Club car park.
