NOVEMBER 2005 MEETING

A few more than forty members and supporters turned out for our last meeting of the year. The meeting featured the final of our knockout contest. The three competitors in the final were Vaughn Parker, Matthew Supranowicz and Donald Galloway.

President Reg O'Malley introduced the evening and welcomed Bob McCrimmon from Ontario, Greg Stewart from Cairns and George Maver from Bundaberg.

Reg advised that Lachie Durham couldn't make it tonight as he started an apprenticeship today so Donald Galloway would go straight into the final of the knockout. He also wished everyone a Merry Christmas and a prosperous New Year.

Iain Bruce played some tunes to start the evening off while the competitors tuned up. Iain is using a new Naill chanter and his pipes had an excellent sound. He gave us an entertaining and musical set of tunes, as usual, including *Lewis Turrell's ¾*, a 3/4 by Donald MacKinnon, the 6/8 *Invercharron Highland Gathering*, the air *I Love The Highlands*, *Cam' ye by Atholl*, the 2/4 *Anachy Glen* And a couple of strathspeys and reels (names forgotten).

Vaughn Parker was our first piper in the knockout final. Reg introduced him with respect to his recent contest successes. He had a good firm sounding pipe but still quite sweet. His jig and reel were particularly good. His tunes included *MacCrimmon Will Never Return, Duncan Johnstone, John Paterson's Mare, Jolly Tinker,* and *Gravel Walk*.

Matthew Supranowicz was the next piper – he had had good year as in competitions as well. Reg mentioned his playing in the Lorient contest and playing with Polkemmet in the World Pipe band Championships. He had a good strong pipe which improved through his performance. The strathspeys were particularly notable and the final jig was also impressive. His tunes included. Samantha's Lullaby, Caledonian Society of London, Rodney Hull QC, In and out of the Harbour, Chase the Train, Rip the Calico, Donald Maclean, Calliope House and Glasgow Police Pipers.

The final player was Donald Galloway. Again a nice sounding pipe – perhaps a bit stronger than we are used to from Donald. His selection was notable for its concentration of good melodic tunes, which included Roses of Prince Charlie, Rose of Allendale, She Moved Through the Fair, Donald MacLeod and Troy's Wedding.

The audience votes were then cast and collected. While the counting was done, Malcolm McRae gave us some excellent music although he suffered a bit of piper's block at one stage.

Then the presentations were done by our Patron Maurie DeHayr and President Reg O'Malley.

The winner was Matthew Supranowicz with Donald and Vaughn each receiving a runner-up prize.

Finally Matthew, Donald and Vaughn played again.

Bob MacCrimmon took the opportunity to say a few words about his background and why he was visiting Queensland.

The raffle was drawn by Bob Payne and won by Vic MacKay.

Reg O'Malley closed the meeting with more Christmas greetings and all proceeded to partake of our traditional sumptuous Christmas supper.

Piobaireachd Meeting

lain Bruce was first to play in our inaugural Piobaireachd meeting for 2006. We had a good attendance of about fifteen despite a very warm and muggy Brisbane summer day. Max Yeo apologised because of exams and Band commitments.

After a few "warm up" tunes (if that were necessary given the weather) to settle the bagpipe, he played for us *Lament for the Only Son*. Malcolm McRae commented that this was a very difficult tune and that lain had carried it off well.

Our next piper was Matthew Supranowicz with Mackay's Short Tune. He had a much stronger bagpipe than lain but still very resonant.

Garry Forno then had a tune. He played the ground of Glengarry's Lament after warming up with an air or two.

Fraser Bolton was next, having done some quick running repairs to his bagpipe. The result of the running repairs was quite acceptable. His tune was *Too Long in this Condition*. Malcolm asked Bob Payne to read the story of the tune from Roy's book.

It was now time to study the set tune – *The Desperate Battle of the Birds*. Malcolm gave us some information on the possible alternative origins of the tune. He said the pattern is fairly complex and the variations are not really based on ground. He plays it as he got it from Robert Brown. He also noted that the Taorluath a Mach and & Crunluath a Mach abbreviations as shown in the Kilberry Book are not correct in modern terms if played strictly according to the notes shown. We sang the tune through together.

After a break for morning tea, Malcolm played the tune for us after Bob Payne read the story from the book.

Peter Burrows had brought along his bagpipe to the Piobaireachd group for the first time and played for us the same tune that Fraser had played earlier, *Too Long in This Condition*.

Maurie DeHayr had also brought his pipes and played *John Garve MacLeod Of Rasaay's Lament*. Bob Payne read the notes on the tune. Maurie got as far as the trebling but then succumbed to the dreaded piper's block.

Malcolm asked for all to think about the format of our meetings and bring our views to the next meeting. We may not wish to change, but some ideas that have been suggested are each player playing twice, reducing tuning time, and having some group tuition. Members of the committee are open to suggestions before the next meeting or at the meeting

The seminar is open to all and will be of particular interest to Pipe Majors, Lead Drummers and others who have an interest in the production of good quality Pipe Band music.

Bob Worall is in Australasia to judge at both the New Zealand and Australian Pipe Band Championships. At the Australian Championships he will be judging Ensemble as part of the project to introduce Ensemble judging here. He will also be consulting with the Principals of Piping and Drumming of the Australian Pipe Band College and in Brisbane with the authors of a proposed manual for Ensemble adjudicators.

He is visiting Sydney, and Adelaide and Brisbane as well as Melbourne and will be conducting seminars such as this one, as well as meeting with smaller groups about particular elements of Ensemble.

Bob Worrall is from Burlington, Ontario, Canada and is one of North America's leading teachers, adjudicators and performers. Prior to retiring from competitive piping in 1983, he won the North American Professional Championship seven times, and held the Ontario Championship Supreme title for 12 of his 13 years in professional competition. In 1977, he was winner of both the March and the Strathspey/Reel events at the Northern Meeting in Inverness, Scotland.

Bob is sought after as a teacher, both for piping workshops and private tuition, and he presents recitals. This has taken him to the USA, Uruguay, Brittany, South Africa and Scotland. He was the senior piping instructor at the Gaelic College in Cape Breton, Nova Scotia, from 1986 to 1999.

His Band judging background includes Cowal, Ulster Championships, World Pipe Band Championships and the New Zealand Pipe Band Championships. Bob is on the panel of senior adjudicators for The Piobaireachd Society, qualified for both piobaireachd and light music.

An educator by profession, Bob chairs the Social Science department and is Coordinator of Student Activities at Queen Elizabeth Park School in Oakville, Ontario.

HOW TO GET TO THE BALMORAL BOWLS CLUB

For those who like to work out their own directions the UBD Reference is Map 160, Q12.

<u>From the Gateway Arterial</u>—turn north at the Lytton Road intersection (just south of the bridge), travel along Route 24 and the Route 23 (Wynnum Road) till you see the Morningside RSL on your left. Turn in as if going to the RSL but go right through their carpark and continue along Jean Howie Drive for about 350 metres. Turn left into the Bowls Club car park.

<u>From the City—go</u> across the Story Bridge, left into Shafston Avenue, then into Lytton Road and Wynnum Road (Route 23). Go along Wynnum Road until you see the Morningside RSL on your right. Turn in as if going to the RSL but go right through their carpark and continue along Jean Howie Drive for about 350 metres. Turn left into the Bowls Club car park.

<u>From the west (old Cleveland Road</u>—Turn into Bennetts Road. Continue along Bennetts Road, across the railway line and a park will appear on your right. Jean Howie Drive goes through the park (the entrance to the drive is near the boundary of the Bulimba Cemetery). Go about 350 metres along the Drive and turn right into the Bowls Club car park.
