JUNE MEETING

About 37 members and guests turned out for our Pipers' Night in June.

First to play was Maurie DeHayr, with the tunes: 3/4s *Lochanside* and *P/M MacLellan DCM*, 6/8s *Leaving Port Askaig*, *Willie Ross*, *El Alamein* and *P/M W Denholm*, air *Donald Ross of Vancouver* (Donald Morrison), MSR *Miss Jeannie Carruthers*, *Lady Loudon* and *Rejected Suitor*

The next piper was James Doran and his tunes *Miss Isabelle T MacDonald*, *McGuire's Jig*, *P/M Wille Gray's Farewell to the Glasgow Police* and the slow air *Shoreline of Lewis*.

Next Malcolm McLaren and Cory Dale gave us a short duet on smallpipes, playing *Green Hills*, *Barren Rocks of Aden* and *The Three Wise Monkeys*.

Roy Gunn was the next player. He started with light music: *1st Battalion Seaforth Highlanders Farewell*, *Highland Wedding*, *Caledonian Canal*, *Bessie McIntyre* and *Carles wi' the Breeks*: and then finished

up with the the piobaireachd *Lament For The Old Sword*.

Then it was back to one of the younger brigade with Vaughn Parker. First he played the MSR *South Hall*, *Shepherd's Crook* and *Traditional Reel* and then the piobaireachd *Black Donald's March*.

At this point we had supper and afterwards moved down to the bar area of the club to see if it might be suitable as a society meeting venue, especially in the hotter months. The raffle was drawn by Innes Barker and won by Glenys O'Malley

Tom McGirr had brought along a brand new set of Peter Henderson drones lent to him by St Kilda retail, which he matched with a McCallum chanter. The pipes seemed to interact adversely with the bar refrigeration from where I sat but they did appear to improve during the strathspeys in the selection he played, which included: 4/4s *The Wee Highland Laddie*, *Intercontinental*, *Killiecrankie*, *The Rose of Allendale*

and strathspeys *The Caledonian Canal*, *Susan MacLeod*, *Maggie Cameron*, *The Ewe wi' the Crookit Horn*, *The Shepherd's Crook*, *Arniston Castle*, *Dora MacLeod* and *The Islay Ball* (2 parts).

Malcolm McRae played next and his pipe sounded better suited to the surroundings than Tom's. He warned us in advance of a new bag and cracked blowpipe stock but they didn't seem to adversely affect the pipe or the piper. His tunes included the slow air *Cruaghach Donn*, 2/4 *The Braes of Castle Grant*, strathspey *The Caledonian Canal*, reel *Alick Cameron* and the jigs *Jeannie Robertson* and *The Barley Mow*.

Iain Bruce was next to play and his pipe had the same problem as Tom's, so I checked by moving closer and the effect disappeared, so it must have been the

refrigeration. His tunes included the 3/4s *Borve Castle* and *P/M Donald MacKinnon*, 6/8s *Mrs MacDougall* and *Capt. Oldfield's Welcome to Kilravock*, MSR *Edinburgh Volunteers*, *Maggie Cameron* and *Sandy Cameron* and finally the piobaireachd *Nameless (hi hio tro tro)*.

Reg O'Malley mentioned that Malcolm, Iain and Roy are shortly off to Scotland and Matthew Supranowicz and Vaughn to Lorient. He wished them well in their various endeavours.

Matthew Supranowicz then finished off the evening of piping with the 6/8s *Ballochyle* and *Duncan McGillivray*.

Piobaireachd Group

We had seven at the July meeting with apologies from Malcolm McRae and Yasu Hamilton.

Roy Gunn was the first to have a tune. After warming up the pipe with some light music, we heard *Lament for MacSwan of Roaig*, with the story of the tune read by Bob Payne.

Iain Bruce was next to play with *The Battle of Waternish*. Bob again read the story. Iain commented that the W was pronounced as a V by Donald MacKinnon, his first Piobaireachd teacher, a Skyeman.

Maurie DeHayr was next, on the third fine-sounding pipe for the day. He played *MacIntosh's Lament* after Bob read the story.

Before we went to the set tune, Tom McGirr gave us *The Desperate Battle*. Bob again did the honours.

Before adjourning for morning tea, Roy led us in singing the set tune for the day, *Chisholm's Salute*, and after morning tea Iain played it on the pipe. Roy said Lachlan McCabe had played this tune with success in Scotland.

Iain got this tune from Bob Brown and then Jim Macintosh and Angus MacKay's book - hence he does not play the second thumb variation as is written in Kilberry, or an a'Mach. There is also some difference in linking notes.

Next to play was Sandy Campbell. His tune was *Glengarry's Lament*.

Finally Tom McGirr came back to give us *Lament for the Old Sword*, with Bob reading the story afterwards.

It had been a great day of excellent pipies and melodious tunes.

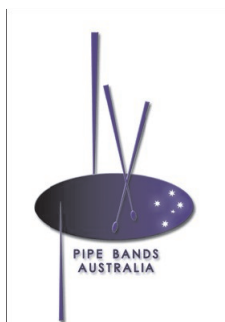
