- ◆ For senior competitions, competitors to submit two of each tune type and play one.
- ◆ After each competition, the floor will be open for all as at a Pipers' Night.
- ◆ The aim is to start meetings at 7.30pm (7.15pm for a 7.30pm start) to allow an earlier finish/more piping/more social time at the end of the meeting. Junior competitions are to start promptly and finish by 8.30pm.
- ◆ In addition we are looking at having two special meetings on a weekend (possibly in June or July and August) to enable our more remote members to attend and to have a more leisurely session of piping perhaps over a morning and afternoon or afternoon and evening.
- ◆ A number of other suggestions are also being looked at by the committee, so it should be a busy year for the Society.

## MAY MEETING

A good crowd of about 47 (including 7 competitors) turned out for our annual Patron's Trophy competition at the May meeting.

President Reg O'Malley started the evening off and introduced the two judges – Maurie DeHayr (our current Patron) and Iain Bruce (the first winner of the trophy). That first competition was in 1983, so this was the 25th time the contest has been run.

The first to play was Tom McGirr. His tunes were *The Pap of Glencoe*, *Caledonian Canal* and *The Little Cascade*.

The following competitors and their tunes were:

John Mulhearn: *The Clan MacColl*, *Piper's Bonnet* and *Willie Cummings Rant*.

While the judges deliberated, James Doran played a few tunes, including the 6/8 *Miss Isabelle T MacDonald*, *The Flowers of the Forest*, *The Haunting* and the 2/4 *Willie Gray's Farewell to the Glasgow Police*. He had a good sounding pipe and it was generally well sustained. He announced his tune types before playing them.

Matthew Supranowicz then played a few tunes including *Jean Mauchline*, *Muckin' of Geodie's Byre*, *The Steamboat* and a set of jigs.

Finally Tom McGirr had a few tunes.

Maurie DeHayr made some comments about the origin of the contest and mentioned that Iain Bruce was the first winner. Iain then spoke about the first Patron's Trophy contest which was held in the Kindegarten Hall at Paddington, where the Society used to meet at the time. He congratulated all the pipers and mentioned the effect of competitive pressure on standard of playing.

He particularly mentioned the need to bring out the unique idiom of each tune type. The upbeat needs to show in the March and the tune does not need to be played fast. There is also a need to bring out the lift in

the Strathspey and have a "good going" Reel. In general, the Reels had been better played than the Strathspeys but there were many unbalanced linking notes.

The raffle was drawn by John Mulhearn and won by Tom McGirr and we adjourned for supper.

## Piobaireachd Group

We had eleven at our June meeting, with an apology from Matthew Supranowicz.

Malcolm McRae was the first to play. After a good warmup of the pipe he played *Glengarry's March*. Bob Payne read the story of the tune. Malcolm related that Bob Brown had used the phrase "Please open the door" to illustrate the timing of the ground.

Next to play was Vaughn Parker who had just arrived. After a warm up and some light music, his tune was *Catherine's Lament*. Bob Payne related the story of the tune.

The next piper was Iain Bruce and he played *The Piper's Warning to His Master*. Bob read the story.

We next heard the story of the set tune for the day, *Lament for Captain MacDougall* before singing it through, and then we broke for morning tea. There was also some discussion on how to organise the meetings when Malcolm, Roy and Iain are all away a bit later in the year.

After morning tea Malcolm played the tune on the pipe.

The next piper to play was Maurie DeHayr. His tune was *Lament for the Only Son*. Unfortunately, his bag was slipping and he abandoned the tune during the Crunluath.

Our final player was Roy Gunn whose pipe was going very well and whose tune was *The Wee Spree*.

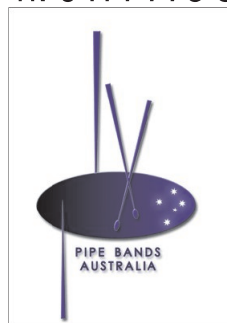
