OCTOBER MEETING

Our Pipers' Night for November was a fairly quiet one, with about 25 in attendance.

We had apologies from the Grogans, Tom McGirr, James Doran and Bob Payne.

After an opening by President Reg O'Malley, first to play was Vic MacKay on his smallpipes. He played a couple of his own compositions, *I've Lost My Grip* and *Ballad of Maurie DeHayr*, having previously distributed copies of the words to the accompanying songs. He had a bit of difficulty with remembering the latter tune so finally sang the song instead and presented Maurie with a copy of the words and music to "his tune".

Matthew Supranowicz was the next to play. On a big sounding pipe he started out in $\frac{3}{4}$ time. His tunes included *Colin's Cattle*, *Banks of Allan Water* and *Highland Brigade at Magersfontein*. Next were some 6/8s including *Miss Isabelle T MacDonald*, *Mrs Lily Christie* and *Lord MacPherson of Drumochter*. Next was a 2/4 March for which he couldn't remember the name, the strathspeys *Susan Macleod* and *Piper's Bonnet* and reels *The Sheepwife* and *Lt Col D J S Murray*. He finished with the air *She Moved Thro' the Fair* and the jig *The Old Wife of the Mill Dust*.

Next to play was Geordie Stainthorpe, who is now in

the Police Pipe Band, after a period helping out at Scots PGC in Warwick for some months. Again a fairly strong sounding pipe. His tunes included the air *Fear a Bhata*, 4/4s *Lord Lovat's Lament*, *Flett from Flotta*, *The Wee Highland Laddie*, 6/8s *Rab's Wedding* and *General Montgomery* and the piobaireachd *The Duke of Atholl's Salute*. A fine introduction to the Society with some enjoyable playing.

Malcolm McRae was next to play on a very nice bagpipe. His tunes included the air *Mist Covered Mountains*, 6/8s *Dovecote Park* and *Farewell to the Creeks*, 2/4s *The Inverness Gathering*, *Barren Rocks of Aden*, *Eilidh's Wedding* (composed by Malcolm) and *The Siege of Delhi* and the piobaireachd *The Sister's Lament*.

The final piper for the night was Iain Bruce, whose tunes included the 3/4s *Lewis Turrell's 3/4* and *The Shores of Argyll*, 2/4s *The Piper o' Dundee*, *The Haughs of Cromdale*, *The Back of Benachie*, *Dornoch Links* and *The Piper's Cave*, the air *Isobel MacGregor*, jigs *The Foxhunter*, *Failte d'on Piobaire* and *Drops of Brandy* and the piobaireachd *The Cave of Gold*.

Finally the raffle was drawn and supper was enjoyed by all.

Piobaireachd Group

We had a good turn up of a dozen or so for our November meeting on a quite hot day. We had an apology from Matthew Supranowicz, who was in the process of finishing a thesis.

Malcolm McRae was the first cab off the rank with *MacLeod's Controversy* after a bit of light music to "warm up" - somewhat superfluous given the weather! Bob Payne read the story of the tune (to much amusement). Malcolm mentioned the "Donald Mor run down" in this tune.

Maurie DeHayr was next to play. His tune was *The Battle of the Bridge of Perth*. Bob Payne read the story. Malcolm commented that the tune was of primary construction - easy to learn but interesting to play and a challenge to keep the tune going through the variations.

Lament for Mary Macleod was Yasu Hamilton's tune. Bob read the story first and Malcolm said that it is quite difficult to play despite the apparently easy technique. It was very nicely played.

Tom McGirr then played *I Got a Kiss of the King's Hand*. Bob read the story.

Next we sang the set tune, *Lament for the Old Sword*. Malcolm commented that the tune is regular and not too long, but there is a need to avoid pulsing the third theme note in each phrase - draw out the first and last theme notes. He also discussed the differences between different settings of the tune in relation to substitution of B for C in the variations.

After morning tea Malcolm played the tune on the pipe.

Iain Bruce was next with *The Battle of Castle Strome* and then we heard from Roy Gunn with *Nameless (Hiharin Dro a Dro)*. Malcolm commented that when this had been set for the Gold Medal many made note errors. It had originally been thought that this tune had no real phrase pattern but recent musicological research has revealed it matches some medieval Welsh harp music.

Finally Tom McGirr had another tune - *The Company's Lament*.
