# DAVID SINCLAIR

Mauire DeHayr has kindly supplied a copy of the comments he made on behalf of the Society at Dave's funeral held on 8 December.

Many here may not know of David's love for the Great Highland Bagpipe - in fact he was not just a player of the instrument, but a dedicated student of it and its music, its history and current development of all its idiosyncrasies.

He was at the founding meeting of the Queensland Highland Piping Society in 1966 and was a dedicated and active member since those days.

He served as Secretary for three years 67-69 and Society records show that during this time he was also Treasurer.

However it is his time as Secretary that he set the standard for the Newsletter - which even today follows mainly the tone set forth by David. He wrote with care for the feelings of players and spectators, though using his wry humour to make a point when needed.

As with most groups formed from a few dedicated individuals the Society fell away badly after a few years and attendances were poor indeed. However it was soon awakened when a letter from David Sinclair (Brisbane, Australia) was printed in the "Piping Times" - a magazine with world wide distribution - the opening lines were as follows

"Piping in Brisbane is looking up, it must be, as it is flat on its back".

Naturally this provoked the response David wanted and the Society sprang back into life and continues to exert its influence throughout the piping scene today.

He served as President of the society in 1980-1982, resigning when he found travelling from Mt. Mee to meetings difficult, but such was his love and abiding loyalty he maintained his interest and enthusiasm. He continued his contacts with the society and piping generally and will be sorely missed by those who came within the compass of his influence and friendship.

#### From the eulogy delivered at the funeral.

David James Sinclair was born in Ascot, Brisbane on 20th February 1924, only two blocks from where Sir Charles Kingsford-Smith was born. David was the youngest of five Sinclair children. David attended Ascot State School and then completed his last four years of education at Churchie. He left school at the end of 1940.

The 1939-1945 World War involved Australia from 3rd September, but David was too young to enlist, so he went to the Barcaldine-Longreach area as a Jackeroo on a sheep station. When Japan entered the War on 7th December 1941, he could not get home fast enough to join the Army on his 18th Birthday. He joined the A.I.F. on his 19th birthday and transferred to 2/5'n Australian Heavy A.A. Battery which was preparing to head for Oro Bay, New Guinea.

On leaving the Army after the War, David did a 4 year Draughting Apprenticeship, a 2 year tobacco farming course, spent 6 years as a sugar-mill hand, 4 years as a Draughtsman in Mareeba, 4 years as a Draughtsman in the Hydro in Tasmania, 2 years with Jack Mulholland, Engineer in Brisbane and 18 years in Brisbane with The Harbours and Marine Department.

David started to learn the bagpipe in 1947 and his first tutor was Jim Lawrie of Paddington, Brisbane. When he went to grow tobacco near Ayr, the Ayr & Lower Burdekin Pipe Band let him join them. David made many friends in Ayr as a result of a big improvement in his playing, and from there found himself welcome in Cairns St. Andrews Pipe Band. It was the same in Tasmania and when he returned to Brisbane he played in several bands. Although no champion, he was most enthusiastic, and became interested in teaching learners with considerable success.

The bagpipe brought David a lovely wife and a ready made family of three stalwart sons, Christopher, Nicholas and Scott Anderson. Nick joined the Brisbane Boys College Band to do the controlled breathing required as he suffered with Bronchial Asthma. Jock Ketchion was teaching the Band, and told his mother Marj that Dave Sinclair was giving extra tuition on a Saturday. In a short time David and Marj were married. Nick was a member of St. Andrews Pipe Band for a while, and David and Nick also belonged to the Blue Bonnets until they disbanded.

About then a call went out to the Queensland Pipe Band Association for a volunteer to help save the Brisbane Boys College Pipe Band from extinction as they had no tutor. For nine years Marj put up with David spending two nights a week at the College and weekends if the band was required to play at a Sunday Chapel Service.

Leaving Chelmer, David and Marj moved to Mt. Mee overlooking the Glass House Mountains and the sea. So attendance at the Queensland Highland Pipers Society meetings was out of the question until David retired in 1984. Finally the property was sold and David and Marj moved to Marcus Beach, and then to Monterey in Tewantin.

Since coming to the Noosa area, David and Marj have formed a bond with the Noosa & District Pipe Band, and as Patrons are proud to have the Sinclair Crest on the Pipe Major's Banner. David maintained his interest in piping, and in the last 15 years received many Ceol Mor tunes on tape and CD and music books on Simon Fraser from a good friend, Dr. Barrie J. McLachlan Orme, who passed away early in January 2007.

Peter says: "D R McLennan was a very good reed maker in those days and I wrote a letter to him and ordered some reeds and asked about the history of GS McLennan!"

# <u>Copy of</u> <u>A Letter from D. R. McLennan Reedmaker in Scotland</u> <u>To Peter Burrows . Brisbane May 1972.</u>

D.R. MacLennan Chanter Reed Maker North Berwick Scotland.

20 May 1972.

Subject. <u>GEORGE STEWART McLENNAN</u>.

Born in Edinburgh 9 February 1884.

Died Aberdeen 31 May 1929 ( Age 45 Years ), and was buried in Echo Bank Cemetery ( Newington ) Edinburgh.

Son of Lieutenant John McLennan. Edinburgh City Police who was a native of the Black Isle, hence the reason for a number of G.S's tunes having place names in and around the Black Isle. His mother was Elizabeth Stewart, a sister of Pipe Major John Stewart of Dundee and who's family hailed from Skye, and were extremely musical. Elizabeth McLennan died when George was about three years of age and his father subsequently married my mother. George and I were therefore half brothers.

George started playing at 8 years of age and won his first Gold Medal in Paisley when 9 years old. He played before Queen Victoria by Royal Command at Balmoral Castle when he was 10 years of age. The following year ( at age 11 )

He won the Amateur Championship of Scotland, and at the age of 12 won the Amateur Championship of Great Britain at Stamford Bridge London. He enlisted into the Gordon Highlanders as a boy (Aged 15) in 1899, and was promoted Pipe Major in 1905 (Aged 21) He was then the youngest Pipe Major ever, in the British Army. He won the Highland Society of London at Oban in 1904, and the same Gold medal at Inverness in 1905. These medals can only be won once! He then went on to win three clasps to the Gold Medal in 1909, 1920 and 1921.

I am now 71 years of age and I can emphatically say that he was the finest player I have ever heard! There was a certain charm in his playing that the rest of us did not have!

His compositions of course speak for themselves!
