SEPTEMBER MEETING

President Matthew Supranowicz welcomed 33 members and visitors to our September Pipers' Night.

James Doran was our first piper and his tunes included the jig *Allan MacPherson of Mosspark*, the MSR Arthur Bignold of Lochrosque, Maggie Cameron and Thompson's Dirk, a 6/8 and the slow air Shoreline of Lewis. His pipe was very nice and for the most part well blown. He gave us a nice variety of solid tunes.

Matthew Supranowicz was next on a good firm instrument and again a solid selection of tunes including the 6/8s Old Adam and Lord MacPherson of Drumochter, Strathspeys and reels The Piper's Bonnet, Susan MacLeod, The Sheepwife and Lt Col D J S Murray, slow air Samantha's Lullaby, jigs The Braes of Mellinish and The Seagull and the 4/4s Flett from Flotta and Wee Highland Laddie.

Larry Flynn has not been seen much at our meetings for a good while which is not surprising since he has been back in Ireland, but Australia is now lucky enough to have him back, He started with the 6/8 *Mrs Lily Christie* and continued with 6/8s, 2/4s and air and some Irish Hornpipes and Jigs.

Iain Bruce was the next in the "lineup" with a resonant

pipe playing a selection of 2/4 marches, *Finlandia*, a selection of Strathspeys and reels, the 2/4 marches *Edinburgh City Police Pipe Band*, 74th's *Farewell to Edinburgh* and *Leaving Glenurquhart*, 6/8 marches *Macleod of Mull* and *Doreen and Iain* and the Piobaireachd *Struan Robertson's Salute*.

Ross Campbell was our final piper for the night. As usual he had it well organised and it was a fine selection of melodic tunes including the 9/8 *Dreaming of Islay*, 6/8 *Kirkwall Bay*, 2/4s *Lord Panmure*, *Memorial Bells of Inverary*, *MacKay's Farewell to the 74th* and 72nd Highlanders Farewell to Aberdeen, slow air *Blink Bonnie*, hornpipe *Donald MacLeod* and jig *Joshua James*.

The raffle was then drawn and all adjourned for supper.

The room where our meetings are held is very good at carrying the human voice, so any conversation during the piping is clearly audible above (or at least alongside!) the pipes. This can disturb others enjoyment of the music, so we would appeal to all to resist the temptation to comment before the piper has finished. We have plenty of time to talk between performances and during supper.

Piobaireachd Group

Our September Piobaireachd Group was attended by seven members, not bad since we had apologies from Iain Davidson, Yasu Hamilton, Ross Campbell, Peter Burrows, Malcolm MacRae and Roy Gunn.

Iain was the first to have a tune and it was *The Prince's Salute*. The Prince in this instance is Prince Charlie's father. Garry Forno read the story of the tune from Roy's book and continued to do so through the meeting.

Tom McGirr was the next piper with *Clan McNab's Salute* and he was followed by Maurie DeHayr with part of Rory MacLeod's Lament. Good to see Maurie playing the big music after his recent battles with illness.

Vaughn Parker was the next piper and he gave us *The Glen is Mine*.

By now it was time for the set tune, which was *Battle of the Bridge of Perth*. Iain gave us a talk about it and then we sang it through together before adjourning for morning tea.

After morning tea Iain played the tune through for us on the pipe and we heard two more tunes: *Kinlochmoidart No I* from Vaughn Parker and *The Big Spree* from Tom McGirr.

Notice of Special General Meeting

- 2. A decision to appoint Alexander James McConnell to make the applicaion for incorporation

The resolution to incorporate will have to be passed by a majority of 75% of those present and voting at the meeting in order to go ahead.
