AUGUST MEETING

A modest number of 25 or so turned out for the August meeting which incorporated the annual meeting.

Before the Annual Meeting, Maurie De Hayr announced that Alex McIntosh, a long time member of the Society and a faithful attender at meetings before his health deteriorated in recent years, had passed away the previous night. All members present stood and Iain Bruce played a lament in his memory.

The minutes of the meeting and the annual accounts are separately printed in this newsletter.

After the annual meeting, there was still some time for piping and our first player was Iain Bruce, whose tunes included the song airs St Columba's Hymn, The Queen's Maries, Jock o' Hazeldean, Morag of Dunvegan, Cailin mo Ruin Sa and Leaving Barra, 2/4s Walter Douglas, Dick Herring and Alec Haddow's Welcome to Stronachullin, the MSR Castle Maol, Inverary Castle and John MacDonald's Reel, hornpipes The Boys of the Blue Hill and The Ship in

thew Bottle and finally Parahandy's Jig.

He was followed by Matthew Supranowicz who played a selection including *The Battle of Waterloo*, *Flett from Flotta*, *Wee Highland Laddie*, *Auld Adam*, *Samantha's Lullaby*, *The Seagull*, *Braes of Mellinish*, *Captain Campbell of Drum a Voisk*, *The Piper's Bonnet*, *Lt Col D J S Murray*, *She Moved thrro' the Fair*, *The Swallow Tailed Coat*, *Rakish Paddy*, *Drops of Brandy* and an unknown Irish reel

Ross Campbell was the last piper to have a tune or two and they included *Alistair and Debbie*, *Bronnie's Blue Brozzie*, *Carradle Bay*, *Edinburgh City Police Pipe Band*, *City of Hastings Pipe Band*, *Hills of Alva*, *Old House* and *Fagail Chluaidh* and some little strathspeys and reels.

All the pipes for the evening were excellent, though varying in pitch and tone.

It only remained to draw the raffle and ajourn for supper.

Piobaireachd Group

A smallish group of seven gathered for our August meeting. We had apologies from Malcolm McRae, Roy Gunn, Andrew McCabe and Yasu Hamilton.

The first to have a tune was Iain Bruce playing *Tulloch Ard*, with Bob Payne readibg the story first. He played the setting from *Ceol Mor*.

Ross Campbell then played *MacLeod of Colbeck's Lament* (Bob read the story). There was some discussion about the need to play an a Mach (Ross doesn't). Despite a short break part way through to correct a wander, this tune was nost musical.

Next we heard from Iain again and he played *The Old Woman's Lullaby* for Bob Payne who had requested it. The setting was from From William Ross (Queen Victoria's piper). He then had another tune, the nameless one *Hi harin dro a dro*. The rhythm of this tune repeats very regularly, especially through the ground.

Next Ross Campbell took us through Lord Lovat's Lament. He first gave quite an extensive talk on the

tune and the text of it is printed later in the newsletter. He also played us a recording of Bob Brown's singing of it.

We sang through the tune and then had morning tea. After morning tea Ross played the set tune throught on the pipe. We then had some light music to finish up the meeting.

Incorporation of the Society

The October Newsletter will contain a notice of a Special General Meeting of the Society under our current constitution and the business to be dealt with will be the incorporation of the Society under the Associations Incorporation Act. This resolution will have to be passed by a majority of 75% of those present and voting at the meeting in order to go ahead.

If decided to go ahead, we also have to appoint a person to actually make the application to be incorporated.

The effect of this would be to make the Society a legal "person" in its own right and to give some protection to members and the committee from anyone seeking to take legal action against us as individuals. It also makes some transactions easier - for example if we wanted to acquire land or accept a legacy under a trust in the future.

There is a fee of \$108.40 to pay when we apply and also small annual fees to stay registered. We also have to make an annual return to the State Government.

If we simply take our existing name and object and put them into the "model rules" provided by the government, the procedure should be simple and quick. The model rules provide quite a good mechanism for managing an organisation such as ours - they are actually a bit more flexible than our existing rules (allthough also a fair bit longer!). The only compulsory officers are a President, Secretary and Treasurer and the size and composition of the committee can be varied from year to year as required. I will shortly be putting on the Society website our present rules and a "mock-up" of how the rules of an incorporated version would look. Just go to www.qhps.org and have a look after about Friday this week (ie 19 September). I'll also include links to the information provided by the State Government on incorporated associations.

In the past, an incorporated association needed to have public liability insurance but under recent changes we can decide for ourselves whether we do so, as long as we stay farly small in terms of assets and income. Also, there are much simplified audit requirements for a small incorporated body, so many of the reasons that have made us hesitate about incorporation in the past are no longer relevant.

Many organisations like ours have incorporated in the last few years because of the protection it provides - for example most pipe bands are now incorporated bodies. When the subject was discussed at the annual meeting there was considerable support for the move. Unfortunately it has not been possible to get all the "i"s dotted and "t"s crossed in time to make a decision in September but all should be in place by our October meeting.

Lord Lovat's Lament

This tune laments the death in 1747 of Simon Fraser, 11th Lord Lovat, after he was found guilty of treason for supporting Prince Charles in the '45 uprising, for which he was beheaded by the English who maintained that despite the latest charge, there had been at least five other instances in his past that would have been just cause for the death penalty.

Simon Fraser appears to have been a duplicitous and notorious turncoat, having supported the Hanoverian cause in the first Jacobite rebellion of 1715. He had a history of committing some terrible deeds and his treachery was always with a view towards his own advancement. He was recognized as the last of the highland chieftains to get around in the full regalia with a retinue of followers in his wake in the grand tradition. His piper was David Fraser, the composer of this tune and also the piper mentioned in the more recently discovered indenture of 1743 that was to have him serve Lord Lovat for seven years in return for tuition from the MacCrimmons, at the expense of Lord Lovat. It is not known if the tuition took place, but his servitude to Lord Lovat was certainly cut short by the latter's capture and execution by the English.

There are a number of settings of this tune and the one that has caught me in its spell is that of Angus MacKay, published in his book of 1838. Curiously, MacKay has the date on his manuscript as 1746, yet the execution did not take place until April of 1747!

The PS published it in 1957 and in the 1977 re-print, MacKay's setting was included as a supplement on pages 249a and b. MacKay's setting is completely irregular, but very beautiful, and to me, the other arrangements are merely attempts to make it conform to more acceptable forms of structure and succeed only in unbalancing its beauty.

If you have not already purchased the Nicol/Brown 'Masters of Piobaireachd' series of CD's, I recommend that you do whilst they are still available. Bob Brown sings this tune through to a few bars into the Taorluath singling on CD vol 9. An interesting point in his singing, is where he sings a high A in the last bar of the doubling of the Ground (or of Variation 1 in PS). The PS score prints a G gracenote on F and MacKay prints a G gracenote on High G! Obviously, MacKay has a printing error, which is not unusual, but the dilemma is - did he mean to print a thumb gracenote on High G, or did he intend to play a grace-noted F? The PS in its reprinting opted for the latter, but Bob Brown definitely sings a High A and it sounds beautifully placed. His singing is so good, and his declared love of the tune make it difficult for me to accept that he meant otherwise, however, there is nothing written anywhere to support it and F does comply with the Ground. I asked Malcolm about this point and he recommended the F. I have decided that in competition, I will play the F, but for my own pleasure, I would play the High A, remembering that the substitution of a High A for an F is not unusual when we are dealing with the doubling of a Ground.

If you try to get this tune from the score, you will find it quite misleading. MacKay writes it in common time, but Bob Brown sings it in 2/4. The PS does not show a time signature, possibly because they end up with bars of differing lengths! I think that it could also have been captured fairly closely in either 6/8 or 3/4. This just goes to reinforce the opinion that piobaireachd should be learnt from the singing and the score used only as an aidememoire.

The tune is clearly in two-bar phrases and Bob Brown sings the C in bar one as a connecting note, not as a crotchet. In the doubling of the Ground where the C in bar one is now embellished and the C at the end of bar two has an appendage, I believe that to treat the first C as a connector is still OK, but the last C would be lengthened at the expense of its preceding High A to signal the end of the phrase. It has been suggested to me that the first C should be held, to be true to the SMMS theory, but Bob's singing in this area does not really help, because he consistently takes a breath at the critical point and leaves the listener wondering.

Another difficulty you will have with this tune's irregularity, is trying to identify the ends of lines. The first is plain enough - it is clearly a four-phrase, or eight-bar line. Should line two be seen as a five- phrase line with a two-phrase 3rd line as marked by MacKay, or does it go beyond that to the end? Once you get to the Taorluath variation, everything seems to come together with three four-phrase lines.

A further ballot was conducted between the remaining two candidates and the result was again tied.
