JULY MEETING

About 35 members and guests turned out for our July meeting with the Jimmy Durham trophy contest. We had five competitors, no doubt somewhat diminished by the current flu which seems to be attacking the schools at the moment.

Matt Supranowicz opened the proceedings. There was an apology from Tam McGirr who is in Scotland playing with the Shotts Band. Matt also introduced our judge for the evening, Ross Campbell.

Malcolm McKellar was the first competitor and his tune was **Charles Edward Hope Vere**.

While we waited for the judge, Sandy Dalziel gave us a few tunes. First up were the first 2/4s he ever leaned, **Duncan McInnes** and **Muir of Ord**, followed by the hornpipe **Donald Macleod** and jig **The Curlew**. Then he played the Australia Highlanders selection and finally the strathspey **Lady Loudon** and the reel **Major Manson**.

The judge having now deliberated, we were ready to hear the results which were as follows:

Ross commented on the playing – good clear execution but sometimes some problems with timing. Good portents for the future. You scribe commented on the

fact that this trophy was originally donated by the Warwick Caledonian Society, so having such a strong representation tonight from Warwick was significant. Iain Bruce related how, when annual Highland Gatherings ceased in Warwick, the Caledonian Society held annual piping recitals involving members of this Society. Ross Campbell commented on hearing Jimmy Durham play in Adelaide a long time ago and also said that day was the beginning of his long study of Piobaireachd – which he recommended to all young pipers.

Craig Wainwright-Fisher from Warwick then played a few tunes. Matthew introduced him as a gap student from Scotland who is working at the Scots PGC College. His tunes were **P/M Willie Grey's Farewell to the Glasgow Police, Maggie Cameron and Duntroon.**

Kirby Douglas then played again for us including the ground of **Lament for the Old Sword**, followed by 2 parts of **Duncan Johnstone** and **Loch Maree**.

The next piper was Matt Supranowicz and his tunes included **Lord MacPherson of Drumochter, Tulloch Gorm, Jock Wilson's Ball, Sandy Gordon, The Banks of Lochiel, Braes of Mellinish, Pitlochry High School Centenary**, a Breton set including Marche, Melodie and Gavotte du Aven, **She Moved Through the Fair**, and Irish jigs including **The Kesh Jig** and **The Foxhunter.**

Finally Iain Bruce had a few tunes but my record of what they were unfortunately appears to have disappeared.

The raffle had three draws. Draw 1 was first done by Peter Borrows but when the ticket wasn't found Harry MacKenzie drew a number which was held by the Silvester family. Draw 2 was done by Vic McKay and won by Glenys O'Malley. Draw 3 was done by Jim Johnstone and won by Vic McKay again!

Watching the Worlds Live

The BBC this year streamed a live coverage of the Grade 1 contest at the Worlds live on the Internet. The coverage began about 6pm on Saturday evening and the last Band played at about 2.30am Sunday, followed by a 2 hour gap before the results were announced, so it was a bit of a marathon effort to watch it.

They covered the qualifying rounds in the morning, which saw some very good performances but started in miserable rain. Thankfully, by the time of the final, most of the rain had gone and there were even shadows at times! Bob Worrall was the commentator and he provided a succinct summary after each performance.

In the finals, the first three Bands, Simon Fraser University, Field Marshall Montgomery and St Laurence O'Toole were certainly very good and difficult to fault. The other three in the top six all had some noticeable glitch. It seems that just a minor problem is enough to put even a highly capable Band out of the top three.

The quality of the picture was quite good and the sound excellent. There was an option to change to a higher quality video but when I tried to do so the video started to get a bit dodgy, and I have a high speed cable connection. Apart from that the signal only suffered from a bit of a refresh delay five or six times in the whole 8 hours or so, so congratulations to the BBC.

Hopefully this is the first of many such telecasts - it's certainly a lot cheaper than flying to Glasgow!

WORKSHOP LOCATION AND ACCOMMODATION

The workshop will be held at the Lutheran Good Shepherd College 115 Eumundi Road, Noosaville. The school has an excellent music facility, class rooms and theatre and a 300 seat concert hall for the Saturday Evening concert. There is plenty of space for parking.

The College is within walking distance of a number of accommodation resorts particularly Ivory Palms and Coral Beach which are close to the Noosa River. We are negotiating with Accommodation Noosa to prepare packages for the workshop but we do not have sufficient information on all accommodation preferences at the moment. We expect this to be known at the end of August.

A mini bus service will be available to pick up and drop off students in the Noosa and Noosaville precinct.

TEACHING PROGRAM OUTLINE: WHAT TO EXPECT

All participants receive over four hours on Friday and six hours of formal instruction on Saturday and Sunday. Sessions are structured according to skill level and interest; music classes cover basic to advanced exercises, practice technique for solo players and bands, instrument maintenance and tuning. There is discussion of everything from music theory and composition to dress and deportment.

The school has instructors on hand for the needs and pace of beginners.

Band Sessions

Part of each day will be devoted to small-group or full-band critique, with an emphasis on band ensemble. Bands of all sizes and skill levels are encouraged to participate.

While you're here, you'll get the chance to work one-on-one with instructors. The instructors provide opportunities for working on solo competition tunes and scores, learning new Piobaireachd, or just getting advice on any aspect of your piping or drumming.
