Minutes of Previous Annual Meeting: *Moved* Alex McConnell seconded Joan O'Neill that the minutes of the 2008 annual meeting which were published in the Sept 2008 Newsletter be taken as read and confirmed. *Carried*

President's Report - 2008/2009

The past year has been an eventful one for piping in Queensland with the advent of the Easter to July pipe band competition season in South-East Queensland a highlight. In many ways there seems to be an improvement in the future prospects of our artform here in Queensland - no pipe band competitions were at risk of being cancelled in the past year, solo entries at outdoor competitions have been high, progress is being made towards a successful Australian Championships next year and a number of our members have competed with distinction in national and international competitions. We have also seen an increase in, the number of younger pipers competing thanks in large part to the work of Sandy Dalziel, Harry MacKenzie and others.

Nevertheless, there are still significant challenges to face. Teaching is only occurring in small pockets and transitions from juvenile bands to the general pipe band population occur only sporadically. It is extremely difficult to recruit members to pipe bands and players to Pipers' Nights and busy lifestyles leave many of us with little time to devote to our hobby.

Along these same lines, it has been a year of highs and lows for the Society. Most of our competition nights have generally, been well-supported, both by attendees and competing pipers. We had 14 competitors at the McCandlish Trophy in November last year and 5 junior players (4 of which are Warwick-based) competed for the Jimmy Durham Trophy last month. To increase the social side of piping, the Society has held sausage sizzles after outdoor solo competitions and your Committee has tried to increase engagement at meetings with a new room layout and by encouraging pipers to engage with the audience. Another highlight was the incorporation of the Society on 13 February this year.

What has been disappointing is the turnout for many meetings (albeit there were some external mitigating factors - extreme wet weather, etc.); precious few pipers have shown up with their pipes for a tune on Pipers' Nights, leaving the burden of the programme to a familiar few. While the standard of playing at meetings has probably been as high as ever, this is not a primary goal of the Society. Players of all levels should feel welcome and players at all levels will benefit from playing in front of an audience of peers. The past year the Society has tried to emphasis this with little success. The Piobaireachd Group has pressed ahead with a slightly different format under the expert guidance of Ross Campbell. Similarly, these meetings have been attended by a faithful few; the low attendance is unfortunate given the high quality of resources available.

Looking forward, the Society probably needs to review the meeting night structure. The Pipers' Nights, in particular, are a unique and invaluable opportunity for pipers but they are not generally seen this way by the piping community in Brisbane. A change of day, time, venue or format might help improve the appeal. The Society had early plans to hold its own solo piping championship and while this year has slipped away from us, it should be high on the agenda for the coming year. The Society should also try and broaden its activities to include workshops and seminars, however this will require a broader base of volunteers than the Committee alone.

For their hard work over the past year, I would like to thank Alex McConnell, our esteemed Treasurer, Secretary and Newsletter Editor; Tam McGirr, Vice President; and Maurie DeHayr, our Patron. I would also like to thank Desley

McConnell and Jack Grant for their often thankless support. I wish the incoming Committee all of the best for the corning year.
