APRIL MEETING

Our April meeting was a Pipers Night and attracted a moderate crowd of about 30 players and listeners.

Maurie DeHayr opened the evening and announced our first player, who was Garry Forno. Garry's selection included a sequence of old favourites which, though not often heard these days, are still good music. They included Corriechoillie's Farewell to the Northern Meeting, Teribus, 79th's Farewell to Gibraltar, Highland Laddie, Brown Haired Maiden, Barren Rocks of Aden, Heroes of Kohima, Battle of the Somme and finally Cock o' the North.

Your scribe then lined up to play, but first reported the apologies received from Reg and Glenys O'Malley and Ross Campbell. The tunes were all in march time but with a variety of time signatures - Scotland the Brave, Marie's Wedding, A Man's a Man, Rab's Wedding, Dr Ross and finally Major Manson of Clachantrushal.

Matt Supranowicz was now introduced by Maurie. Matt was practising for the Adelaide competitions, so we heard some of his contest tunes. His selection included *The Braemar Gathering, Lord MacPherson of Drumochter, The Piper's Bonnet, Susan Macleod, The Sheepwife, Lt Col D J S Murray, Samantha's*

Lullaby, Bronnie's Blue Brozzie, McRaes of Lennie, Bungee Jumper, 24th Guards Brigade at Anzio, Campbell's Farewell to Redcastle, various reels and a Breton set - Suite Plinn. Quite a solid performance!

Maurie DeHayr was next to play. He had recently removed the drone valves from his pipes and they definitely seemed to be producing a fuller tone than previously. His tunes included *The Heights of Dargai*, Wings, Kilworth Hills, Loch Maree, Siege of Delhi, Glengarry Gathering, Loch Rannoch, Lachie's Lullaby, Donald Ross of Vancouver, The Haughs of Cromdale and Australian Ladies. A most musical mixture.

Michael Rodger had also brought along his pipes and his tunes included Castle Dangerous, Wings, The Rowan Tree, The Clan MacRae, Caber Feidh, Drumlithie, the ground of Macleod of Raasay's Salute, Two Ronnie's Maggies and The Curlew. Michael was also preparing for the Adelaide competitions.

Finally Matt Supranowicz gave us another shorter selection including Miss Elspeth Campbell. Captain Campbell of Drum a Voisk, Lucy Cassidy, Tam

Bain's Lum, Troy's Wedding and The Braes of Mellinish.

All then made their way to the supper.

Michael being the last available piper, Innes Barker was asked to draw the raffle and it was won by Marion Clow, who was here on another "highland dancing" visit from Scotland.
