HELD ON 25 OCTOBER 2010 AT BALMORAL BOWLS CLUB**

President Tam McGirr welcomed everyone to the meeting at 7.45pm

Present: 12 members and others - as per attendance sheet

Apologies: Alex & Desley McConnell, May Maclean, Joan O'Neill, Margaret Paterson, Mrs Barker, Donald Galloway, Vic MacKay, Vik and Sandra Supranowicz

Minutes of Previous Annual Meeting: *Moved Maurie DeHayr* seconded Matt Supranowicz that the minutes of the 2009 annual meeting which were published in the Sept 2009 Newsletter be taken as read and confirmed. *Carried*

President's report: Tam spoke to his report, a copy of which is printed in this newsletter. *Moved Ross Campbell*, seconded Elizabeth Galloway that the President's report be received. *Carried. Matt Supranowicz moved thanks to Alex McConnell for work done over many years.*

Accounts: In the absence of the Treasurer Maurie DeHayr presented the accounts. PBA Membership: *Moved* M DeHayr, seconded R Campbell that we affiliate. *Carried. Delegates T McGirr and R Campbell.*

General Business

In a period of general discussion it was put forward that we need to reconsider our meeting formats. We need to consider both the pipers and the audience and we need to involve younger players more. Perhaps occasional meetings on a Saturday would work. The load of Band work on younger players is a problem along with family commitments. Perhaps we need to produce a philosophy of the Society. There was also some discussion about judging at our contests and what level of comments are needed. It was suggested we re-print a copy of the constitution.

There being no further business the meeting was declared **closed at 9.50pm**

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Tom McGirr's report is printed below unaltered as he requests. However, there are a number of factual errors which have been corrected with footnotes.

I for one have my doubts over any of it. Surely this year of all years has taught us that in the world of bag piping nothing, even that most sacred, ever stays the same.

In summary and again some of these points are my own, this society is a great movement. I can assure you that my travels in the county reveal that we are the envy of many states.
